



PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

™ FROM THE DESK OF DEACON STEVE ™

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, recalling the visit of the Magi to the child Jesus. It is said that the New Testament is hidden in the Old, and the Old Testament is revealed in the New. The Gospel reading of today is a great example of that saying and consistent with Matthew's style of showing how events of the Old Testament related to events in the New Testament. We often refer to the Magi as "kings" but they were likely astrologers who were well versed in watching the skies. Scientists conjecture that the star of Bethlehem was likely a confluence of three planets in the night sky, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn, giving the appearance of one very bright star. This would have occurred about the year 7 B.C.

Based on Old Testament prophecies the "star" in question signified the birth of a Jewish king. They traveled to the capital city, Jerusalem, to inquire where they might find the new king. At that time the king in Jerusalem was the murderous Herod. When he heard of the Magi's inquiry he called on the chief priests and scribes to find out what he could about this new king. They informed him that the prophecy was that this new king would be born in Bethlehem of Judea. Calling the Magi to meet him secretly he asked them to find the new king and report back to him so that he, too, might pay homage. His true intent was to kill the one whom he considered to be a rival.

This scenario is similar to one found in the Old Testament where an evil king sets out to destroy Moses and the Israelites. He summoned Balaam and his two servants who, like the Magi, came from the East. Balaam refused to curse Israel and instead gave a prophecy that a star and royal staff would arise out of Israel and be held in high esteem by all nations. (See chapters 22-24 from the book of Numbers.) This is the star that the Magi saw and followed.

We know how the story ends with the Magi visiting the new King, Jesus, and avoiding Herod on the return to their homes in the East. Here as we approach new year 2024 we, too, must look to a star. That star is not one to be found in the sky. Rather we must look to Jesus, "the bright and shining morning star (Revelation 22:16) and "the light of the world" (John 8:12; see Isaiah 42:6). What better resolution can we make in 2024 than to follow our star of Bethlehem, Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord!

MESSAGE #32 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



A puzzling element about the Holy Eucharist is how the consecrated bread and wine can actually become the Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ. For in appearance they remain but wheat and grape, so our human reason struggles

with the spiritual reality that comes with the transubstantiation of the elements. The answer comes down to accepting that there are some things that are truly mysteries, i.e., that cannot be proven within the intellect. Those mysteries have to be proven spiritually within our hearts. At the Last Supper Jesus took the bread and wine of the meal and assured his disciples that they would ACTUALLY BECOME his Body and Blood. Then he told them: "DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME." At Mass we follow his command to DO THIS in his memory. Take note that he did not say that the bread and wine would be *symbolic* of his Body and Blood. He assured us that they *are* his Body and Blood.

St. Hilary of Poitiers (now modern day France) was a bishop in the fourth century. He was such a great mind in the early Church that the esteemed St. Augustine numbered him within the twelve most influential thinkers on which he relied. Joe Heschmeyer is a modern Catholic apologist (one who explains and defends the faith) who commented on St. Hilary and the Eucharist as follows:

"If there was any remaining ambiguity about whether or not Hilary understood the Eucharist to be Christ's literal, physical Body and Blood, there can be none after his next comment: 'As to the verity of the flesh and blood there is no room left for doubt. For now both from the declaration of the Lord Himself and our own faith, it is verily flesh and verily blood. And these when eaten and drunk, bring it to pass that both we are in Christ and Christ in us. Is not this true? Yet they who affirm that Christ Jesus is not truly God are welcome to find it false. He therefore Himself is in us through the flesh and we in Him. whilst together with Him our own selves are in God.' So Hilary leaves room to deny the Real physical Presence of Christ in the Eucharist...but only if you're ready to 'affirm that Christ Jesus is not truly God." (emphasis added) (Word on Fire website, Jan. 13, 2015.)

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING KITS



In This Place:

A History of the Campus of St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Pikesville

Our "In This Place" lecture will cover the acquisition of the land, the first buildings, the cemetery, and subsequent changes to our St. Charles Borromeo campus.

Just after the establishment of the Village of Pikesville, the Archdiocese of Baltimore was convinced by the large landowners around the village to establish a parish and church in the newly laid out village. So in 1847, land was acquired, and by 1848 a church was built. From that time, St. Charles Borromeo Parish has been an integral part of the landscape around which Pikesville itself grew. The lecture will follow the history of the physical campus of the Parish as it expanded and contracted over its 175 years, bearing in mind that the physical space is just a small visible manifestation of the community spirit that the Parish has within itself and without to the greater Pikesville community.

Lecturer: Pamela Wright has been dubbed the unofficial historian of St. Charles Parish. She and her family have been parishioners for over 30 years; she converted to Catholicism at St. Charles and has served in many capacities in many different ministries. She was the editor for Mary Jane Klein's St. Charles Borromeo Parish: The story of its people and their faith, 1848-1998, a history of the parish written for the 150th anniversary. Before her retirement, she was an administrator at the University of Maryland Baltimore and is currently a freelance scientific editor. She has a Master of Arts in Theology from St. Mary's Seminary and University.
