

PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

○ FROM THE DESK OF DEACON STEVE ∞

I suppose that it might be providential that the gospel passages for the Sunday Mass for this week and last week come during the month of January. For a great many of us we greet January not only as a new year, but as a new beginning for us in many ways. We resolve to lose weight, drink less, learn a foreign language, take up a musical instrument, pray more, or in some other fashion find a way to move forward in a positive direction in our lives.

A week ago we heard the call of Saints Andrew and Simon Peter from the gospel of John. Now as if we were daydreaming when that was proclaimed, our attention is again directed, this time by St. Mark, to the calling of Andrew and Simon Peter (as well as James and John) to follow Jesus. It is sort of like God telling us "that in case you didn't hear me last week, let me call to you once again! Come, follow me." While our many resolutions are sincerely made, they often quickly lose their energy until they settle in as a long-lost good intention. As the saying goes, "The road to Hell is paved with good intentions." I trust that none of us wish to travel that road.

God is constantly calling us to conversion. We hear it with our ears when the words of Scripture are proclaimed at Mass, and we can hear it with our hearts in times of prayer, reflection and contemplation. What is our response to God's call? On Ash Wednesday (February 14) we will hear the call of God through the prophet Joel when he says, "Rend your hearts, not your garments." That can be interpreted as God's way of urging us to experience a profound conversion, one that seeks fulfillment and peace in the things of faith instead of in the temporal things of the world.

The best resolution that we could make in this new year, 2024, is to do what we can to grow closer to God. We do that by loving God and loving our neighbor. Our bulletin each week is like a table of contents of the many ways we can accomplish the two goals of loving God and loving our neighbor. We have numerous prayer opportunities in addition to Sunday Mass. We can make casseroles for the hungry, support our food pantry, attend weekday Mass, give financial support to our parish and special collections, and participate in the Nine Day Novena for Life.

Jesus is calling us to follow him just as he called Andrew, Simon Peter, James and John. How will we respond to his call to each one of us?

SANCTUARY LAMP INTENTION




Our sanctuary lamp is lit this week: For the Intention of the Michael Okolo-1 Family

I also want to share some very important news for our pastorate that I received from the Archdiocese of Baltimore. To help us better minister to our large Hispanic population, the Archdiocese has decided to assign an Associate Pastor to us who comes from a Spanish-speaking culture. This will happen quickly — our new bilingual priest will join us in February, and I will have more information about him in the weeks ahead as we warmly welcome him to St. Gabriel and St. Charles Borromeo. Fr. Rodney will be moving, and his final day with us will be **January 31**st.

We thank Fr. Rodney for working and serving with us during these past five months, especially in a time of great changes and challenges for a new pastorate! He will preside at **all masses this weekend**, **1/20-1/21**. Please greet Fr. Rodney after the Masses with your good wishes and words of thanks.

MESSAGE #34 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



As I write this Eucharistic message the Universal Church celebrates St. Hilary of Poitiers, a convert and fourth century bishop in France who battled against the Arian heresy. The Arians said that Jesus Christ was not God. His teachings on

the Holy Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - are still revered today in year 2024. In 1851, Pope Pius IX proclaimed Hilary to be a Doctor of the Church. In regard to the Holy Eucharist, St. Hilary said, "When our Lord himself declares, as our faith teaches us, that his flesh is food indeed, what room can remain for doubt concerning the Real Presence of his Body and **Blood?**" The words of Jesus at the Last Supper as he blessed the bread and wine are quite clear. He tells us the bread becomes his Body and the wine becomes his Blood. Then he commands us to do this in remembrance of Him. In the 6th chapter of John's gospel he tells his followers that they must eat his flesh and drink his blood. This proved to be a very difficult challenge for them, and many of them left him from that day. Yet as Catholics we are taught that the Holy Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our faith. When we approach the altar to receive him at Communion, we are not walking away from Him as many of his doubting disciples did. Instead, by our actions we are imitating St. Peter who with the twelve chose not to leave and said, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Let us resolve never to take our reception of Jesus' Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Real Presence of the Eucharist, lightly.


