



PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS SO Dear Parishioners.

So Lent is here once again. Whether we come today with no idea of what we'll do for Lent this year or whether we come with a clear plan, we can think about what Jesus asks of us in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Today's Scripture passage about Jesus' 40 days in the desert is from Mark's Gospel, and it is far shorter than that in Matthew or Luke. Mark focuses less on the temptations themselves and ends with the heart of the New Testament message: Jesus says, This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel. Jesus' time in the desert was one of preparation for his ministry. We can prepare during Lent for the upcoming Paschal Mystery by thinking of three questions.

First: How have we been saved by God already in our lives? Are there times of trial from which we've been delivered? It's so easy to see only what's in front of us, and the sufferings of the moment. Reflect back on years gone by and actively look for ways that God has delivered. This should serve to deepen our trust in God.

Second: How have we been led to God? How have we been blessed, and saved? What methods of prayer brought us closest to him? Take those lessons and take advantage of them this Lent.

And the third question: How might we best follow the Lord into the desert? Perhaps focusing on all the penitential practices of the season might be a way to open our hearts to the Kingdom. The Kingdom, having been rooted in our hearts, enables us to bring it to others.

As we prepare to receive the Eucharist, let the grace of the sacrament bring us ever closer to further union with our saving Lord. Confident that the Lord will help us identify what specifically we should do this Lent, let us take a moment of quiet and listen to God's direction in the silence of our hearts. Have a blessed week!

WHAT CONSTITUTES SERIOUS ILLNESS?

The law does not specify what constitutes a serious illness but leaves this determination to those involved, especially a priest who is the minister of the sacrament.



According to the General Introduction, "a prudent or reasonably sure judgment, without scruple, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness; if necessary a doctor may be consulted" (PCS 8). In other words, a normal judgment is to be used by the priest in determining if the person is seriously ill, and, if necessary, a physician may be consulted in helping the priest make his determination.

In a footnote to paragraph eight referenced above, "the word periculose has been carefully studied and rendered as "seriously," rather than as "gravely," "dangerously," or "perilously." Such a rendering will serve to avoid restrictions upon the celebration of the sacrament. On the one hand, the sacrament may and should be given to anyone whose health is seriously impaired; on the other hand, it may not be given indiscriminately or to anyone whose health is not seriously impaired" (PCS 8, footnote 8). According to Canon 1005, the minister may anoint if there is any doubt about whether the person is seriously ill.

MESSAGE #38 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



As I write this reflection, I am 70 years old. When I was 7 years old and in second grade at St. James School in Hopewell, Virginia, a wonderful nun, Sister Mary Bernarda Loncon, was the person who prepared my classmates and me for our First

Communion. Sixty-three years later Sister Bernarda is still with us, living in a retirement facility in Georgia. The Sisters of Mercy were based in Baltimore but served at schools from the mid-Atlantic and down through the southern east coast. Sister Bernarda was the first one to instill in me a great love and deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist. The difference between then and now is how I approach the article of faith that Jesus' Real Presence is found in the consecrated bread and wine at holy Mass. Back then I possessed the gift of childhood innocence that opened my heart completely to the miracle of the Blessed Sacrament. As a second grader I could kneel at the communion rail and simply know with certainty that what I was about to receive was Jesus. Things get more complicated as we get older. Our intellect can get in the way of faith. Using our gift of reasoning is not something bad, however it occasionally becomes a hurdle on the run toward faith. As a child I could know with 100% certainty that in reception of Holy Communion Jesus was entering my body and transforming me to be like him. As I got older my mind got more analytical causing me to ponder too heavily on terms like "transubstantiation." When I approach the altar to receive Jesus in this Sacrament I always pray that the Holy Spirit will instill in me the childlike faith in the Eucharist to allow me to simply trust that Jesus became one of us so that we could become one with him, and that his promise to remain with us to the "end of the age" is found in a very special way in the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith. St. Thomas Aguinas may have said it best: "What our senses fail to fathom, we grasp through faith's consent." Let us pray, "Holy Spirit, fill me with a childlike faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, Amen."

If you have Sirius XM, channel 129 is Catholic Radio, while channel 130 is EWTN Radio.

Want to see Catholic programming on television? Go to Verizon channel 285 for the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN). EWTN is also found locally on Xfinity/Comcast channel 238. On Satellite, EWTN is found on Direct TV channel 370 and Dish Network channel 261. The programming on the FM stations, Sirius XM, Satellite, Verizon, and Xfinity/Comcast is available 24/7.

NOTICE: DEADLINE FOR FILING ABUSE CLAIMS

The Maryland *Child Victims Act* removed the statute of limitations for the filing of lawsuits in which the plaintiff claims that he or she was sexually abused as a minor. The Archdiocese of Baltimore (AOB) filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Reorganization to: (1) achieve equitable compensation for victim-survivors who submit claims; and (2) ensure the continuation of AOB's ministries. The petition was granted by the US Bankruptcy Court for the District of Maryland. This Court set the date of May 31, 2024 as the deadline for the filing of child sexual abuse claims related to AOB personnel. It is required for all parishes to share the *Publications Notice* and the *Claims Deadline Notice* in various formats. For more information and/or to obtain a claim form visit:
