



# PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

### ○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ∞

Dear Parishioners,

We all know we should listen to Christ. We have all been told we should do as God commands. There is a prayer that begins, "Father, I abandon myself into your hands. Do with me what you will ..." While most of us would affirm this sentiment on some level, if we take a moment to really sit with the idea of abandoning ourselves into God's hands, of letting go of what we want and asking God to do what only he wills...well, some of us might begin to squirm.

And then we have the story of Abraham and Isaac. Abraham didn't squirm. Abraham trusts in God's goodness. This goodness is highlighted in our second reading from the Letter to the Romans. We are reminded that God, who did not spare his own Son, but handed him over for us all, will give us everything we need along with his Son. This is the depth of God's love for us. God, who gave us his beloved Son, commands us: This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.

Our God did not hold back anything, not even his beloved Son, to lead us to the goodness he desires for us. In the Transfiguration, he shows us the glory that awaits us when we live and love in service of him.

And this God is present here today. In this sacred season, God is inviting us to listen more closely to his beloved Son who invites us to take and eat, to receive the gift of his body, poured out for us in this Eucharist. This is the love that leads us through our Lenten journey and through our lives. May we, in this sacrament, grow in trust and learn to follow Christ's voice in all we do.

Thank you all for joining us at Mass every Sunday. Invite a friend or family member to our community. Also, mark your calendars and join us for our Lenten Discussion Series - Renewed in the Lord: The Gift of the Eucharist at St. Gabriel Thursdays at 7:00 PM in the church on February 29, March 7, 14, 21. Please take advantage of this opportunity to grow in your knowledge and love of the Holy Eucharist as part of your Lenten journey!

I have been spending quite a bit of time introducing Fr. Miguel to parish life at the pastorate. Fr. Miguel enjoyed his first week among us, meeting various parishioners in the mix. Have a blessed week!

# MESSAGE #39 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



Is it possible that the most thought provoking lesson that one could hear about the Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist could come from a Protestant minister who did not believe that Jesus was truly present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in

the Blessed Sacrament? From my perspective, that is exactly what I experienced. About 35 years ago I heard a story about a discussion that took place between a Protestant minister and a Catholic priest concerning the Holy Eucharist. The minister said that he did not believe that the Eucharist was anything more than a symbol. He noted that there was nothing that could possibly convince him that the Catholic priest's belief in the Real Presence was a correct theory. But then the minister told the priest that if he did come to a belief in the Real Presence that is taught by the Catholic Church, then he would crawl on his hands and knees to receive Him in Communion at the foot of the altar. As Catholics we are taught that Jesus is in fact substantially present in the form of bread and wine when we receive Him at Holy Communion. We have to ask ourselves if we believe as strongly as the Protestant minister suggests that we should? No one is saying that we should literally approach the Eucharist on our hands and knees each Sunday (or anytime we receive the Sacrament), but we should spiritually and mentally come to Communion with every ounce of that kind of humility and reverence in thanksgiving to Jesus Christ for fulfilling his promise to be with us "until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Quoting the apostle Thomas let us pray, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28)

so one now sees everything everywhere transfigured



#### NOTICE: DEADLINE FOR FILING ABUSE CLAIMS

The Maryland *Child Victims Act* removed the statute of limitations for the filing of lawsuits in which the plaintiff claims that he or she was sexually abused as a minor. The Archdiocese of Baltimore (AOB) filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Reorganization to: (1) achieve equitable compensation for victim-survivors who submit claims; and (2) ensure the continuation of AOB's ministries. The petition was granted by the US Bankruptcy Court for the District of Maryland. This Court set the date of May 31, 2024 as the deadline for the filing of child sexual abuse claims related to AOB personnel. It is required for all parishes to share the *Publications Notice* and the *Claims Deadline Notice* in various formats. For more information and/or to obtain a claim form visit:
