## A Message from Archabbot Douglas Nowicki

Mary, Mother of God/Epiphany/  
World Day of Peace

January 1-2, 2022

A Blessed and Happy New Year to the entire Saint Edward Parish Community. This weekend we begin a New Year, 2022 with a three fold celebration: the Feast of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God; World Peace Day and the Feast of the Epiphany.

Last weekend we celebrated the Birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ—the Gift of God’s Love made visible. Through Jesus, God enters human history. God comes into the world not as mighty Caesar, but as a humble human infant born in a stable. The feasts that we celebrated this past week, however, were not all sweet and cuddly: the flight into Egypt (Joseph and Mary flee King Herod), slaughter of the Holy Innocents, Saint Stephen—martyred; Saint Thomas Becket—martyred. It’s a stark reminder to all of us that the Crib is never too far from the Cross.

The great German Lutheran theologian, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was killed by the Nazi’s, wrote a book called The Cost of Discipleship in which he attacked “cheap grace” - a grace without

the cross—a cover for ethical laxity. But he also preached the importance of “costly grace” - i.e. putting God first in your life (spending time with God in prayer). Costly grace comes from the reality that Jesus died for our sins and so we are forgiven. According to Bonhoeffer, “cheap grace...is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross...It is grace without the ...hope of life and death, and the resurrection of Jesus.” Costly grace, on the other hand, involves making sacrifices for others because we seek to be true disciples.

Mary embodied the “costly grace.” She suffered the pains and agony of Jesus. She made the sacrifice of her life because she trusted that God’s grace would be there always to help her. Through the Angel Gabriel at the Annunciation, Mary responded to God’s call to action with a firm and trusting faith. Her faith did not exempt her from the sorrows she endured in life, but she trusted that God’s grace would always sustain her no matter what came to her in life.

In **The Feast of the Epiphany**, we see that the private revelation of the Angel Gabriel to Mary and Joseph, now expands to the shepherds and Wise Men. Pope Francis reminds us that “the Epiphany is a present, ongoing

event that now includes us.” The true Epiphany is that God reveals His love to the world through Jesus Christ who through the power of the Holy Spirit gives Himself to all people, in all places, at all times, The mystery of Christ’s self-giving love moves from the Crib to the Cross.

Today we are living through a time of turmoil and challenge. We need a **“World Day of Peace”** more than ever. As the world struggles with the pandemic, we see the refugees fleeing Afghanistan, the thousands of refugees who made their way to Central Europe fleeing the poverty and chaos of their homelands in the Middle East, the world needs a **“World Day of Peace”**. There are no simple solutions. But we also are aware of the refugees named Mary, Joseph and Jesus, fleeing the terror and chaos of the murderous King Herod.

A handwritten note found on the wall of Mother Teresa’s room when she died conclude with these words: “Give the world the best you have, and it may never be enough; give your best anyway. For you see in the final analysis, it is between you and God. It was never between you and the world anyway.”.

**Registering in the Parish of Saint Edward**

The law of the Church defines a parish as a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within a [Diocese]. The pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a pastor as its own shepherd under the authority of the diocesan bishop. The law of the Church also states that a parish is to be territorial and embraces all the Christian faithful within a certain territory [ cc 515, 518]

The certain territory for Saint Edward Parish established at its founding is the area of Palm Beach Island from the north end of the Island south to Sloan's Curve.

To register as a parishioner of Saint Edward requires residence within its territory.

**First Penance and First Eucharist Programs**

Beginning in the First Grade, children of registered parishioners are to be enrolled in a two- year Parish Religious Education sacramental program. Registered parishioners whose children attend Catholic Grade Schools are to participate in the immediate sacramental preparation programs of the Parish. Please contact the parish office for more information.

**Confirmation Program**

Children of registered parishioners who are to be enrolled as candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation must have been baptized, capable of renewing their Baptismal promises, and properly instructed by participation in the two-year parish program beginning in the seventh grade. The Sacrament of Confirmation is usually scheduled for September, when the candidate is a ninth grader.

**Marriages at Saint Edward Parish**

Saint Edward Parish reserves the celebration of the sacrament of marriage to registered parishioners who are practicing Catholics and their immediate family members. Registration requires residence within the territory of the parish [ the North End of the Island south to Sloan's Curve.] New parishioners must be registered for one year before being considered for the scheduling of a marriage.

**Saint Edward Marriage Regulations**

All couples intending to marry at Saint Edward must meet with the pastor. No date is promised or scheduled before this initial meeting with the pastor, who is to assess the freedom to marry of the couple and explain other marriage regulations. Saint Edward Parish is not a destination site for marriage and Saint Edward does not rent the Church to non-parishioners for marriage ceremonies.

**The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be administered to the sick after the age of reason when the person begins to be in danger due to sickness or age. It is preferred that the sacrament be administered when the person is in control of their faculties. Please contact the parish in emergencies. After hours leave a message as directed by the parish voicemail.
