

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR TWENTY EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 15, 2023

In the world, generally, a small percentage of the population controls most of the world's goods. This is true in the United States, and this was true in the Roman world of Jesus. There was strict division between the aristocracy and the general population which defined social-economic barriers. The ancient world saw wealth as static, i.e., not to be redistributed, so that there was no upward mobility (which was why Jesus was challenged, many times, socially). Wealth was finite, as was status, and was distributed by God, hence the belief that the wealthy would retain their wealth and the poor would remain poor.

But this static world would be challenged by Jesus. After all, he redefined 'family' in the sense that his 'family' included those who heard his word and lived it out, in opposition to a 'family' which was related solely by bloodlines or kinship. Of course ... Jesus loved his Blessed Mother and his foster-Father, and there was no intended negation of this. In last week's gospel, he redefined 'honor' and 'shame', not focusing on society but rather seeing them in relation to God Himself! In Saint Matthew's Gospel today, he redefines society and imposes a definition of what equality means, superseding the established divisions. But ... there was a catch.

Obviously, at a royal wedding, only the social elites would be invited. Just as in current-day receptions after the wedding, seating arrangements were made, and the more important people would be seated closer to the host. The 'pecking order' was evident – one knew one's place in society by the seating arrangement. Earlier, the king would have sent out invitations so that planning could take place and a response would have been recorded. When the day of the wedding came around, there was an expectation that the guest would be present, and much food was prepared, and significant financial expenditures had been made. When many declined to come, a concerted effort was made to canvass the kingdom, expecting that people would make good on their response. The story even mentions violence. Imagine the shock to those listening to the parable when they heard that people declined the king's invitation.

But imagine the greater shock when a general call went out to find people to fill the hall. Normally, it was the social elite who would have filled the hall. Not so now. Everyone was on the same footing now, and a royal decree went out to everyone. Like Jesus, the king broke social norms. All, including outcasts, were equal in the eyes of the king.

Still, imagine further that there was an understanding that the Temple was a microcosm of the universe. God was at the center, as was the Holy of Holies in the Temple where only the High Priest could go. Then, farther out, the priests were allowed to minister in the outer sanctuary, and then farther out, again, there was a court of the men and another of the women, then a court of the Gentiles. Each created even more distance from the Holy of Holies. Those listening to Jesus would have realized that the parable was even more applicable when it came to access to God: everyone was on the same footing now and all were equal in the eyes of God. There were not more 'courts' to enter. That's why all were wearing white garments.

But this was not the end. Although everyone had access to God, each person would need to be conformed to his ways. One could not simply give lip service to the requirement for change in one's life while still living a sinful life. Divesting from sin was the key to finding eternal life. Even the Temple leadership needed to change, and they were not excused simply because they believed they were at the apex of the hierarchy. God, the King, overturned the collective order of society. He calls everyone to change, and although rejected at times, some did choose to respond and were given a new status as equals in the Kingdom of God. Indeed, many are called, but only those who truly convert their lives are chosen for the Kingdom.

Registering in the Parish of Saint Edward

The law of the Church defines a parish as a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within a [Diocese]. The pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a pastor as its own shepherd under the authority of the diocesan bishop. The law of the Church also states that a parish is to be territorial and embraces all the Christian faithful within a certain territory [cc 515, 518]

The certain territory for Saint Edward Parish established at its founding is the area of Palm Beach Island from the north end of the Island south to Sloan's Curve.

To register as a parishioner of Saint Edward requires residence within its territory.

First Penance and First Eucharist Programs

Beginning in the First Grade, children of registered parishioners are to be enrolled in a two- year Parish Religious Education sacramental program. Registered parishioners whose children attend Catholic Grade Schools are to participate in the immediate sacramental preparation programs of the Parish. Please contact the parish office for more information.

Confirmation Program

Children of registered parishioners who are to be enrolled as candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation must have been baptized, capable of renewing their Baptismal promises, and properly instructed by participation in the two-year parish program beginning in the seventh grade. The Sacrament of Confirmation is usually scheduled for September, when the candidate is a ninth grader.

Marriages at Saint Edward Parish

Saint Edward Parish reserves the celebration of the sacrament of marriage to registered parishioners who are practicing Catholics and their immediate family members. Registration requires residence within the territory of the parish [the North End of the Island south to Sloan's Curve.] New parishioners must be registered for one year before being considered for the scheduling of a marriage.

Saint Edward Marriage Regulations

All couples intending to marry at Saint Edward must meet with the pastor. No date is promised or scheduled before this initial meeting with the pastor, who is to assess the freedom to marry of the couple and explain other marriage regulations. Saint Edward Parish is not a destination site for marriage and Saint Edward does not rent the Church to non-parishioners for marriage ceremonies.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be administered to the sick after the age of reason when the person begins to be in danger due to sickness or age. It is preferred that the sacrament be administered when the person is in control of their faculties. Please contact the parish in emergencies.
