This program will focus on physical boundaries and safety, as well as present knowledge and skills that will foster safety in the digital age.

A valuable resource to consider as enhancement to your participation in the *Goretti Project* is the *Protect App* and the *Protect Young Eyes* webpage. These resources provide (some free, some at a cost) mini lessons about digital safety.
