## PASTOR'S COLUMN

It may surprise you to realize that it has been almost a year since our churches were able to 'reopen' following six months of only 'taped' or 'live-streamed' Masses resulting from the Covid pandemic. Congregations could gather provided they followed the strict protocols implemented as Covid cases continued to increase. While it was somewhat a return to 'normal,' the situation was far from ideal. Among other things, assurance had to be given that churches were thoroughly cleaned and sanitized before and after every service. Those attending Mass were obligated to always wear a facemask. Though numbers attending were restricted to a small percentage of the church's capacity, social distance was to be observed in the pews between individuals or family units. There was no opportunity to extend a physical sign of peace and even Holy Communion was distributed and received in a different than customary fashion.

As the months progressed some of the restrictions have been relaxed. Throughout the weeks of this summer, attendance numbers at our weekend Masses have been gradually increasing. For this we are grateful and, of course, thankful to all who have been patient and cooperative as we continue to curtail the spread of the virus.

Though several Covid virus variants have surfaced, time has come to step up our efforts and return to the more customary observances to which we are familiar – particularly in the practice of our Catholic faith. It is believed this can be done with a degree of safety as more and more people obtain the vaccine and continue to be cautious in public group gatherings.

Of course, a principal area of focus for us as Catholics is seeing that we do our best as a worshipping community, particularly when we gather to celebrate the Mass. During the months of the 'pandemic lockdown' – when Masses were offered by a priest

and, at best, one or two others who provided assistance – my heart

would ache and long for the full and active participation of a congregation. While I recognized the privilege given to me as a priest to offer the Mass for the benefit of all members of the Church (regardless of the number of people in the pews!), I grew in my appreciation for the celebration of Mass as a corporate act, an act of the whole assembly gathered for worship.

We are blessed when we have a variety of liturgical ministries in play in our celebrations of Mass – priest, deacon, altar server, communion minister, lector, usher, musicians, cantors, greeters, ushers, etc. But, because the liturgy is a corporate act of the gathered assembly, there are certain parts of the Mass done by the whole assembly (the congregation of the faithful and all the ministers) in order to express the corporate nature of this act. Through these actions, the entire congregation of the faithful joins itself to Christ in acknowledging the great things that God has done and in offering the sacrifice.

To all who have not been able to be with us during this past year, we look forward to welcoming you back to the celebration of the Mass. And to those who remain unable to join us for one reason or another, know you hold a place in the prayers of our faith community as we anticipate the day when you are with us once again at God's altar.

## Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 19:4-8 | Eph 4:30—5:2 | Jn 6:41-51

### **GROW** AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink – bread from heaven – that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!

### **GO** EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, perhaps we can say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.

**ACTION** Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle – the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world – or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!

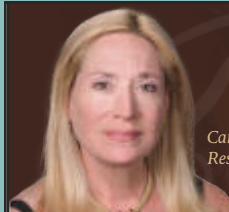
