

PASTOR'S COLUMN

I hear it said more and more these days, where has the time gone? It seems like summer just got underway, and yet within a couple of weeks, children will be back in school while many young adults have already headed off to college. We are seeing more and more notices in our weekly parish bulletin, items posted on our collaborative website, and details sent through emails providing announcements about the beginning of a new year for the programs and activities in our parishes. To be honest, it is not only the summer season that passes all too quickly. Many of us also find that years seem to fly by as well.

We pray the words in Psalm 90, "Teach us, O Lord, to number our days." I sometimes lose count of the days forgetting that each and every one of them is a gift. It is often an effort to remember how precious each day is – a day that has never been before and never will be again. But, when I recognize each day as a gift from God, I am able to stand before that day and before God in gratitude and with hope as I look forward to whatever signs of God's presence will come to me during the day.

Of course, approaching time in this way is much easier said than done. Many of us are overcome with multiple demands – work, families, others for whom we care, volunteer work. We find ourselves chained to calendars and even sync our calendars with others to make sure things do not fall through the cracks.

Most days, if not every day, the list of things to do is much longer than the time available. Just thinking about what lies ahead, makes us exhausted even sometimes before the day begins! What to do?

Many have found having a quiet reflection each day can make a big difference. The reflection time does not have to be that long. It might even include reading one of the psalms or a single chapter from one of the gospels. If the beginning of the day is too hectic, perhaps getting to work a little early would allow you a few moments of quiet reflection. And, as many have found, there are even prayer apps for your computer, phone or tablet that provide brief, quality spiritual reflections. Another practice is trying to reduce the amount of multi-tasking you do. For example, when you are driving, you can turn off the radio and resist the temptation to check email when stopped at a traffic signal. Take that quiet moment to look around - see the colors, look at the sky, observe people and remember that each of them is as beloved by God as you are.

But, most especially, give thanks ... for 'this is the day the Lord has made for you to rejoice and be glad in it' (Psalm 118).

THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

Twenty-first Sunday in **Ordinary Time**

Jos 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b | Eph 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32 | Jn 6:60-69



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Have you ever felt nervous in standing up for something, or in taking a position on an issue? Even when the stakes are not particularly high, like a classroom debate over an author's meaning in her text or requesting that customer service fix a take-out order gone awry, it can be nerve-wracking for many of us to have this kind of engagement. It is especially difficult when we sense conflict. Why is that? Why do we care so much what others think of us? What about when the stakes are literally life or death? In today's first reading, Joshua is imploring the people to decide which god they will serve, and he boldly proclaims: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." In the Gospel, some of Jesus' disciples reject his teachings and drift back to "their former way of life." Jesus asks the Twelve whether they, too, "want to leave." Simon Peter responds with the rhetorical question, "Master, to whom [else] shall we go?" Like Joshua, he is bold in his own pronouncement: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Today's readings encourage and exhort us to go "all in" when it comes to discipleship. The implication is clear: it matters not what others think of us, or what attraction they might hold for us to acquiesce to them. God alone is the source of life, and the truth. He offers us a way - it's that simple. We simply must decide to serve him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

At times this commitment, this life of discipleship, is more difficult than other times. Faith is a personal and communal relationship with our Triune God, and just like our human relationships it requires attentiveness, and "[living] in love as Christ loved us." Just as a spouse or roommate can annoy us - being messy, hearing the same joke over and over, and don't get me started on who gets to control the remote! - we may get upset with God because our expectations are not met. But God is God, not "who we think God ought to be." Therefore, today's readings are an encouragement to remain steadfast when things are difficult, with St. Paul comparing the love of Jesus for the Church (all of us!) with the mutual love between a husband and wife. No one said it would be easy. Just as a good marriage requires communication, give-and-take, and large doses of forgiveness, so does our relationship with the Lord require prayer, confession, repentance, and thanksgiving.

Place Joshua's words on your refrigerator this week: "Decide today whom you will serve ... As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Brainstorm about how each member of your household can do that.

However, on September 6 (Labor Day), the weekday Mass schedule will revert to the following:

- Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at 9:00 am (St. Irene, Carlisle).

NOTE: The Sacrament of Penance (Confessions) will be available from 9:30-10:30 am following the Saturday morning Mass.

We are happy to schedule confessions at your convenience and the availability of a priest. To schedule a time for confession, please call the parish office to speak to Fr. Frank or Fr. Bill or leave your name and contact info and they will contact you to arrange a convenient day and time.

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth always worth is obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and life blood and а of discipleship.
