

PASTOR'S UPDATE

With the observance of Palm Sunday, we begin our Holy Week journey to Easter. As we observe these sacred days before us, we should be ever mindful this week is not simply a recalling of "what once happened to Jesus," but what is **now happening** among us as people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with God's Spirit of Holiness.

Holy Week and, in particular, the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, are central to our faith. In and for the Church, these days have precedence over all other celebrations – they are events too important to compete with any other event. As St. Paul reminds us, if Christ did not die and rise from the dead, we have labored in vain.

Though the days of this week are not designated as "holy days of obligation," I encourage everyone to seek ways in which you are able to observe Holy Week in a meaningful, prayerful, and reflective manner. I hope for many of you this will mean joining us for the celebrations of the Sacred Triduum.

Holy Week is also a fitting time to think about what we can do in our own lives to act as Jesus did – sacrifice something for the sake of others. In Christ's case, it was his life and precious blood. Whatever the sacrifice, large or small, what truly matters is the spirit in which it is made. As you reflect on the meaning of Holy Week and take in the power of the Resurrection, remember we are called by Christ to sacrifice ourselves for the good of our neighbors, especially the poor. As Jesus gave himself up for you, let us give of ourselves on behalf of others.

Looking forward to our celebrations on Easter Sunday, I live in hope that amid those visiting the area next weekend, we will be greeting anew many of our own parishioners who are returning to Mass for the first time in a while. Let us offer them a warm and hospitable welcome reflecting the joy we share in the new life made possible by the Paschal Mystery of the Lord Jesus.

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Lk 22:14-23:56 or Lk 23:1-49

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Palm Sunday can seem like a study in contrasts. We hear the jubilant account of Jesus riding triumphantly into Jerusalem. Then we listen to the Passion narrative, reminded that Jesus' kingship bears little resemblance to royalty as we perceive it. He will suffer and he will die. As Paul describes it, "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him." Jesus tries to explain this to the disciples, who don't fully grasp the events about to take place, instead quarreling over who would be the greatest. Yet even in this chaos of misunderstanding, Jesus continues to teach them, promising that those who stand by him in his trials will join him in the kingdom of heaven. There are certainly times when we fail to fully perceive and understand all that the Lord is teaching us, or why we are undergoing certain trials and difficulties. As we enter into Holy Week, we can ask Jesus to help us understand the meaning of the cross in our own lives, using this time to reflect on the meaning of his sacrifice for each of us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we listen to the Passion narrative, we hear Peter betray Je sus, the soldiers jeer at him, and a passer-by being told to carry Christ's cross. Only Luke's account describes the two criminals, one of whom demanded that Jesus "save yourself and us." The second criminal rebukes him, asking Jesus to "remember me when you come into your kingdom." After Jesus dies, the centurion glorifies God, a good man takes him down from the cross, the women prepare his body for burial. As we enter Holy Week, we will have time to reflect on Jesus' last days, but also on the individuals in the crowd the day he died. How did they react? How would we have reacted? What can we learn from the women who stayed beside Jesus, the criminal who looked beyond his own pain and sin to see Jesus as Messiah, and even Peter in his initial betrayal? During the week ahead, we can also make an effort to attend each liturgy of the Triduum, using this time to deepen our faith as we prepare for Easter.

PRAYER Take time to read the Passion narrative at home. Invite Jesus into your heart. If you've fallen a little behind on your Lenten commitments, Holy Week is a great time to hit refresh.
