

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Over recent days, a mailing was sent to all registered parish families with information concerning our **2023 Grand Annual Collection**. A letter from me about the importance of the Grand Annual and a **Financial Report for the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year** were included in the mailing.

Parishioners who did not receive the information about the Grand Annual are encouraged to contact the Parish Office by phone or email and the materials will be sent to them. You may also find the materials available this weekend at the church entrance.

On reviewing the financial report for this past year, I noted the challenge we face in keeping to a balanced operating budget. It is becoming necessary to use monies held in reserve for other purposes to meet our financial obligations. Given the present times, I realize this may be a situation a number of families and individuals are also facing. However, I continue to trust in your goodwill and the generosity you have shown previously in helping to meet the increasing costs of maintaining the facilities and sustaining the programs supporting the mission of our parishes and the Church.

In recent months, a **Collaborative Finance Council** was formed to serve our two parishes. With this new council in place, we will continue to address the financial obligations and concerns of our parishes. And I once again express my gratitude to the members of the former Holy Family and St. Irene's Finance Councils for their oversight and advice.

As your means allow, I humbly ask you to prayerfully consider a generous gift to this year's Grand Annual Collection.

MASS QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Answer to last week's question:

The <u>Pall</u> is a square of linen stiffened with starch, cardboard, or plastic that is set upon the chalice to protect the Sacred Blood of Christ from being contaminated by dust or insects. The term is also used for the white cloth placed over a casket at a funeral. The <u>Corporal</u> and <u>Purificator</u>, as noted previously, are also white linens used at Mass to ensure no fragments of the Sacred Species are lost.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We all want to feel special and be noticed. We see it in Adam and Eve's decision to eat the fruit in the garden after the snake promises "your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods." (Gen 3:5) The scribes and the Pharisees in today's Gospel certainly appear to fall into this category of wanting to be noticed: "All their works are performed to be seen," Jesus says. To be clear, we ARE each unique children of God: chosen by him and called by name. We are "wonderfully made" by the Lord (Ps 139:14), and that alone makes us valuable beyond measure. The problem arises when we begin to see our value as something we are responsible for on our own. We no longer give glory to God and acknowledge him as the fount of all good things. Instead, we are tempted to take credit for ourselves - that was the error of the scribes and the Pharisees, and it is one against which we should guard ourselves.


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's readings are instructive and, frankly, a good reminder that as God's beloved children baptized into Christ, we are called to a higher standard. What is this higher standard? First, it entails "[giving] thanks to God unceasingly," as St. Paul said in today's reading. It also involves practicing what we preach in a way the Pharisees do not. At the heart of Jesus' message today is telling us, his followers, how we are meant to live. We are to follow Jesus' words and strive to imitate his actions with humility and love. Does this mean loving unconditionally? It does. Does this mean not seeking places of honor but rather having a servant's attitude? It does. Are these postures and attitudes that come naturally to us as human beings? As descendants of Adam and Eve? Perhaps not. But if we wish to make Jesus the master of our lives, let us discern where we can be serving others better and putting our energy into the work of building God's kingdom.

PRAY The Catechism calls humility the "foundation of prayer." (CCC 2559) Let us pray this week for the humility to do God's will without any praise or recognition. Let us ask the Holy Spirit for wisdom to know what the Lord wants from us and to joyfully fulfill that call even if it means working in the shadows where no one will notice.
