

PASTOR'S COLUMN

As I announced at our Sunday Masses last weekend, upon observing my 75th birthday this May, Cardinal Sean will grant me "Senior Priest" status. With this designation, I will be resigning as Pastor of the Concord-Carlisle Collaborative.

Does this mean I will be going into 'retirement'? The answer to that question is "yes and no." Those who are parents have a sense as to how this works. Once you become a mother or father, you remain a parent regardless of the age of your child. Your parental vocation is forever. The obligations you have as a parent may change as your child grows and matures, but you will always be a "mom" or "dad." A priest, too, does not ever retire from his vocation. His vocation as a priest is forever!

However, as a "Senior Priest," I would not be assigned as a Pastor but would be available to assist in a parish or other church-related setting. There I could offer Mass, provide the Sacraments, and engage in ministries in which I would be interested and willing to assist. Where I reside would also be my choice (a parish, a family home, Regina Clergy (our archdiocesan residence for senior priests), etc.). Over the coming months, it is to these matters to which I will be giving thought and prayer before my designation as a "Senior Priest" becomes effective sometime in the spring.

Presently, of course, I continue with my commitment to the day-to-day obligations as Pastor of our collaborative. In doing so, I am fortunate in having a fine and dedicated clergy and lay staff along with a core of many faith-filled parishioners engaged in service to our parishes. Whomever the Lord intends to succeed me as Pastor will be blessed to have their assistance.

The appointment of a new Pastor for the Concord-Carlisle Collaborative remains with Cardinal Sean. Before submitting names of priests to the Cardinal for his consideration as Pastor, the Clergy Personnel Board will review information about our parishes and, most likely, will conduct a visit to the collaborative for a meeting with Pastoral and Finance Council Members and staff. As this process gets underway, your prayers will be much appreciated.

For now, join with me as we draw close to observing the grace-filled Season of Lent and look forward to celebrating the Paschal Mystery of our Lord with a joyous Easter!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Why me? It could be a flat tire, a lost job or a serious illness. When inconvenient, unpleasant or even downright horrible things happen, it is understandable to wonder why God allows it. I know that is what goes through my head in extreme adversity. God can do all things, so why wouldn't he change "this thing" for me? In the Gospel, we see Jesus curing Simon Peter's mother-in-law of her illness, but many of us don't have our prayers answered like that. Instead, we may relate more to Job in today's first reading when he says life is a "drudgery" and he "shall not see happiness again." The reality is that God's ways are not our ways, so we can't know why some people endure hardship while others receive miracles. But we can change how we respond to those hardships when they arrive. Just as this passage from Job is understood better within the context of the whole book, discrete events in our lives are part of something larger than ourselves. Praying with Scripture, including reading more of Job, can help us understand how God is molding, refining, and yes - always loving us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When we are tempted to feel like Job is a good time to embrace the age-old practice of "offering it [suffering] up." As a child, my parents explained that offering it up meant I was telling God I would happily suffer in exchange for it helping someone else. What does this really mean? Everything stems from our being united to Christ in our baptism and being participants in his priestly, prophetic and royal office. We offer ourselves, our whole being, including our worship, praise, joy, gratitude, bodies and even sufferings to God as sacrifice. So, to "offer it [suffering] up" is a powerful way of taking a bad situation and allowing it to be used for something good; to give our inconvenience, pain and grief to the Lord and ask him to unite it to Christ's suffering for the good of others. It is a redemptive act, a form of love-in-action. St. Paul is a great example of someone who suffered gladly, and in today's second reading he shares that "to the weak [he] became weak, to win over the weak."

PRAY Offering up our sufferings and difficulties is a way to participate in the redemptive work of Christ. It is a simple way to pray and can keep our focus on God throughout the day. There isn't any one specific prayer for doing this. Instead, when something unpleasant or painful happens, take a moment to acknowledge it and give it to the Lord. It can be as simple as saying, "Lord, I am happy to endure this for the benefit of others." You may want to insert a specific intention or offer it for the souls in purgatory. It's not always easy – especially when your suffering is great – but give it a try this week.
