

Reflection

PRAYER

The Sacred Scriptures for this Sunday gives us the theme of prayer. Of the many styles and types of prayer, that is not important, the important point is TO PRAY!

"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trail and joy."

Saint Therese of Lisieux

There is a huge difference between knowing about prayer and praying. Knowing about prayer is an academic journey; there can be mental prayer and vocal prayer, meditation and contemplation prayer, there can be centering prayer, mystical prayer, private and communal prayer. But again, the important point is TO PRAY!

Saint Augustine wrote, "True prayer is nothing but love." Prayer should arise from the heart. Saint John Vianney said; "Prayer is the inner bath of love into which the soul plunges itself." Saint Francis de Sales wrote, "Everyone of us needs half an hour of prayer each day, except when we are busy - then we need an hour."

The two official forms of prayer in our Roman Catholic tradition are the celebration of the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours. Beyond these, the choice of prayer is left to each individual—whatever best helps you enter into communion with God: devotional prayer, scriptural reflection, meditation, or even quiet silence. What matters most is simply this: pray!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Studying Scripture is not a side dish on the plate of practicing the faith. It is an essential component of the virtuous life, and without it, our faith will surely falter. In his second letter to Timothy, Saint Paul reminds us that the Scriptures are the inspired Word of God and they train us in righteous living and equip us for every good work. There will undoubtedly be times when we feel ill-equipped – when we are fatigued, frustrated, or concerned. It is precisely in these moments that we're invited to go quickly to the holy Word of God! Read it, pray with it, and invite the Spirit to speak to you through it. There you will find the wisdom needed to face every circumstance.


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Our faith journey was never meant to be a solitary endeavor! We see this in today's first reading when Aaron and Hur stand beside Moses, holding his weary arms in the air as the battle rages on against the Amalekites. This image of the three men on the mountain – Moses with his arms raised high, Aaron and Hur on either side supporting them – is a powerful image of companionship in the Christian life. When you feel too weary to pray, look around – the Lord has likely given you companions who can support you precisely in the ways you need at this time. Pay attention, too, to who God might be inviting you to support in prayer. Our Gospel tells us that God always hears our prayer and calls us to be persistent in prayer. Certainly, God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night." God calls us to persist in prayer because it reveals our faith and trust in him that we constantly bring our needs before him.

REFLECT

Our readings offer helpful tools to turn to when discouragement or isolation may cloud our spiritual vision. Take some time this week to listen to the Lord's voice in Scripture. Or, if you're feeling weary, ask a few friends to pray with and for you. Remember that although God may seem distant, he always hears us. Be persistent in bringing your needs to him and wait with patience – surely, he will come swiftly to your aid.

World Mission Sunday October 19, 2025





What is World Mission Sunday?

It's an annual Global Day of Prayer and Solidarity for the Missions. On that day, there is a global collection - the only one mandated by the Code of Canon Law (see Canon 791.4) - taken in every parish, in every diocese, in every country - even in the missions - for the support of the missionary work of the Church.



World Mission Sunday is not just a second collection. It is the Church's annual call to put the missions and evangelization at the center of our life and parish communities. It reminds us that every Catholic is by baptism, a missionary disciple, and that our own nation, and our own Archdiocese, was once a misison territory, sustained by the very collection we now have the privelege to support.

Established in 1926 by Pope Pius XI, World Mission Sunday is coordinated by The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of the four Pontifical Mission Societies. Through the support of the faithful on World Mission Sunday, the Society provides support for pastoral and catechetical programs, church construction, healthcare, and education in more than 1,124 mission territories - places where the Church is young, often materially poor, and sometimes persecuted, but where the seed of the Gospel is being planted and nourished.




