**Second Sunday of Advent** 

Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,

This weekend's Gospel speaks of beginnings. In the second week of a new liturgical year, we hear the very beginning of Mark's Gospel: "Beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." Mark wrote his Gospel between 65-70 AD in Rome. His audience there would have been struck by the opening words "gospel" (i.e. good news) and "Son of God." The Christian community in Rome was living in dangerous times. Persecuted Christians were being executed by being lit on fire to serve as streetlights (a.k.a. Roman Candles) throughout the city. The only good news was how the Romans proclaimed their battle victories as the "good news of Rome." The son of god was a title befitting only a Roman Emperor. So, Mark's Gospel starts with a provocative sentence, proclaiming good news about an executed Jewish man who Christians called the "Son of God." This likely stirred hatred of Christians by those supportive of the status quo in Rome at the time and explains why Christians experienced such persecution.

In today's world, we read this sentence and may see no deep meaning. But how many people today live as if Jesus' ministry is in fact good news or believe him to truly be the "Son of God?" How many of us need a new beginning in our life where we see the world through the eyes of Christ? This is a wonderful way to focus our prayers this Advent season.
