

## **Special Synod Update**

## Dear St. Pat's parishioners:

Following our recent synod, created as a response to a letter from the Archdiocese prompting us to increase our "vitality" in five specific areas (i.e. Financial Stability, Facility Utilization, Celebration of Sacraments, Mass Attendance, and Culture of Encounter), the facilitators of that synod met via Zoom to discuss ideas generated during the synod and to formulate an action plan based on participant input.

We agreed that while productivity during the synod was high, with many truly thoughtful and potent ideas recorded, the actual time for interacting was limited. Therefore, we are seeking further input before we move forward to consider specific action steps towards increasing our vitality.

Each facilitator has reviewed the notes taken during their synod sessions, with particular focus on recommended actions for consideration in our 2021 Strategic Pastoral Plan.
