Sacred Encounters Reflection

"J. was in a location I've observed troubled individuals sit so I check it each week. He was new to me, but I checked in. When I approached I said 'hiya friendo' as I tend to. He appreciated the warm, casual greeting, I interpreted as he leaned toward me, so I asked if I could help. He snerked and leaned back telling me I couldn't help him, so I started to squat so I could be at his level,

since he was now daring me to flake on him, with that body language, and I tried to personify a sister to him. As I was just coaxing him back forward when everyone came around me and so I signaled for everyone to stop, because their presence was getting him to recoil again. I talked with him. He told me about his TBI, how he needs nothing because he steals everything he needs because businesses can't see him. He said he thought living on the streets would be easier, that he just wanted to throw himself in the street to end it. I told J. about my vital young friend who was just hit by a car at speed, how everyone close to me with TBI now many years since have found the other side and that he just needs to push for the other side. I encouraged him to put me in his weekly rotation, and told him I'd be looking for him."
