Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,

A 2019 Pew Research poll of Catholics found only a third of all Catholics believe in transubstantiation or believe that bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ during Mass. That means two-thirds of all Catholics do not believe this, believing Communion is only a symbol of the body and blood of Christ. Transubstantiation is a concept central to our faith. As many know, the Catholic Church teaches that "the Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life.'"

This is why Archbishop Etienne called for the Year of the Eucharist during this past pandemic year in the Church in Western Washington and asked all Catholics to closer examine the meaning of the Eucharist in our lives. He has also called us to change our posture at certain points in the Mass.

Something powerful happens at the altar when the Holy Spirit is invoked to transform simple bread and wine into the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Our reverence for the sacredness of this moment is designed to help all Catholics

better understand this impactful transformation not only at Mass but in our lives when we partake in Holy Communion. We are called to become what we eat; we are called to become Jesus in the world and be transformed by this union with the divine.

June 2020. As we bring this special year to a close, Archbishop Etienne will celebrate this special Mass, with Christ's great commission to send us forth to love and serve. Mass will include a multicultural Eucharistic procession at St. James Cathedral on June 5th at 5:30 PM.

The solemnity honors the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, which includes a

procession of the Blessed Sacrament displayed in a monstrance.
