The Archbishop today responded to my meeting with him a few weeks ago (see a link to the letter below). The news is not good. He is giving us more time (until the Jesuits place someone as pastor at St. Joseph), but that is all.

He is committed to the process of moving forward with his decision to have us merge with either St. Joe's or Sacred Heart. The original completion date was July 1, 2022. But that date will be extended to allow our community time to negotiate with the new St. Joe's leader if that is the direction the parish chooses to go. To say I am disappointed would be an understatement.

We will discuss the next steps after Mass this Sunday. I hope you are able to come and join the conversation.
