#### **Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,**

How do we handle rejection in our lives? Jesus leads by example for us this weekend. Our Lord faces rejection and hostility from his hometown acquaintances. In the experience, he teaches us all how to deal with similar moments in our lives as disciples. As we witness in the Gospel, Jesus does not shy away from speaking the truth about his mission even though he knew his words would be unpopular and make people upset. Jesus did not fear hostility or even rejection. His response was simply to walk away when things got out of

hand. Jesus did not allow rejection, resistance, or persecution to stop him in his mission. It is so easy for us to be impacted by the negativity of others. We can spend enormous amounts of time and energy trying to defend our perspective or "our truth." Sometimes we dwell too much on our own hurt feelings, frustration, or anger in such moments of rejection. But this is not the way of Jesus.

Please join for parish-wide Synodal Listening this Sunday January 30 at 2pm via Zoom, when we'll endeavor to focus collective energies on this first query from Pope Francis: *How have you experienced the Holy Spirit in your life and at Saint Patrick Church?* 

All are invited to reflect deeply in your heart, preparing in mind an initial or full Response. If you feel comfortable sharing your reflection parish-wide, write or type your Response in preparation for Synodal Listening on January 30 at 2pm via Zoom.

Please consider the following dates and times for further Synodal Listening:

Sunday February 13<sup>th</sup> after Mass or Zoom 2 PM; Thursday February 17<sup>th</sup> Zoom 7 PM; Sunday March 20<sup>th</sup> after Mass or Zoom 2 PM; Thursday March 24<sup>th</sup> Zoom 7 PM; Sunday April 3<sup>rd</sup> after Mass or Zoom 2 PM; Thursday April 7<sup>th</sup> Zoom 7PM.

We'll then address both the query above and the query below from Pope Francis: How do we experience the Holy Spirit at Saint Patrick Church now, and how will we continue growing with the Holy Spirit in our Journeying Together as a faith community?

Privacy will be respectfully honored by all Listeners, and there are no requirements for written responses. Yet every respondent affirming a Scribe's written Response will find their contributions reflected anonymously in a final synthesized report. The month of April will be available for parishioner feedback and final revision of the report to Pope Francis.

#### Wednesday Movie Night

We have an especially interesting documentary for this coming Wednesday's movie night, "Since I Been Down" (<u>https://www.sinceibeendown.com</u>).

Meet Kimonti Carter. He joined a gang at age 11. At age 18, sentenced to 700 years in prison for his role in a drive by shooting in 1997. Against all odds, Kimonti became an inspirational role model within the prison system. As a leader of the Black Prisoners' Caucus, at age 34, Kimonti founded TEACH (Taking Education and Creating History), a remarkably innovative prisoner education program. Kimonti was part of a community profoundly impacted by the city's disinvestment in housing, education, and employment as well as our policies in the 1990's. This film, told by the people who have lived these conditions, unravels why children commit violent crime and how these children – now adults – are breaking free from their fate by creating a model of justice that is transforming their lives, our humanity and the quality of life for all our children.
