Beloved members of Saint Patrick Church,

Our parish-wide January 30 Synodal Listening yielded fruitful responses to the first query from Pope Francis: *How have you experienced the Holy Spirit in your life and at Saint Patrick Church?* If you wish, you are welcome to prepare an individual Response to this query and share it aloud or in writing on February 13th <u>via Zoom</u> at 2 PM *or*, *(due to a parish council schedule conflict)* via Zoom at 7pm the same Sunday, February 13. You are also welcome at *anytime* in this Synodal process to contact a Listener or Scribe, scheduling a one-to-one session to share your personal reflection individually. Our book studies will set the stage for the author's pending visit to Seattle and his talk about his book at Seattle U on February 16th at 7 PM.
