Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,

This weekend we hear the story of Jesus' encounter with the woman caught in adultery. I'll be sharing a beautiful insight into this reading that I first heard Fr. Bryan give in a homily during my time in Everett. Since I am preaching this weekend, he is letting me share it with you (with appropriate attribution). For the purposes of this week's letter let us look closely at St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians. The overall theme of his words to the people of Philippi was our call as disciples of Christ to share in his suffering so that we might share in his resurrection. We all will share in Christ's crucifixion (the death of a favorite job, the end of a marriage, a terminal health diagnosis, even our own death someday). It is how we navigate our own personal crucifixion that demonstrates if we truly are getting the message of Jesus: to carry our crosses and follow him on the high road all the way to Calvary.

Rest In Peace, Carolyn

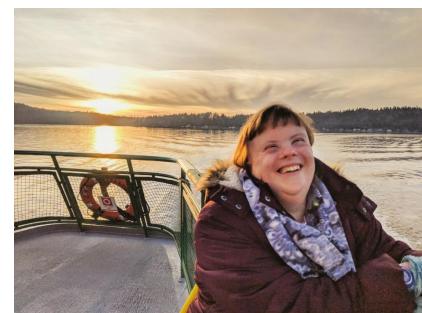
L'Arche Core Member, dear friend, and St. Pat's parishioner **Carolyn Drobnicki** passed away suddenly this past Saturday at her parents' house.
