The parish website now includes the PowerPoint presentation given to the Archbishop during our April 25 meeting, a copy of the Archbishop's April 29 letter reaffirming his decision to close our parish by July 1, and the Advocate's May 4 letter requesting until September to complete the process and expressing our disappointment in the lack of dialogue and consultation in the Archdiocesan process.



Several work groups have continued researching options as part of our discernment. You've recently heard from the Canon Law group. Alternative Communities and St. Pat's/St. Joe's discernment groups will present on Sunday, May 22nd in Paddy's Place and on Coffee Hour Zoom. Hope to see you there.

Next week you'll hear more about an upcoming survey to gauge where each of us are in our own discernment.
