Pentecost was in full bloom this week at the Josephinum in downtown Seattle with the return of immersions of Catholic school students from the Seattle Archdiocese. The Holy Spirit was alive, and hearts were on fire as these young people served those living on the margins at the largest Catholic Housing Services low income, supportive housing project in the state. For nearly two and a half years, no student has stepped through the doors of the Josephinum to serve the residents there due to a global pandemic. But all that changed this week as an army of 25 eighth graders from St. Therese Catholic Academy burst through the doors of the normally quiet lobby of Christ Our Hope Church and the Josephinum, and their love exploded in a rainbow of activity, energy, and enthusiasm, as they cared for the 200 residents who reside above the Church. Oh, happy day! This was a true Pentecost moment.

Advocates Update

We have preliminary results back from our recent survey. According to the survey, 53% of the St. Patrick community will be moving forward with the Catholic Church. 87% of those will be going to St. Joseph once St. Patrick is closed (3% to Sacred Heart; with the other 10% split between seven different Catholic Churches). This means 47% of the St. Patrick community will not be moving forward with the Catholic Church according to the survey. At the same time, 76% of the St. Patrick community supports a Canon Law challenge of the Archbishop's decision to merge/close St. Patrick. 58% of the St. Patrick community will financially support a Canon Law challenge. Thought you'd want to know the results of the survey. Deacon Dennis will be sharing these details in a letter to the Archbishop in the coming



Pentecost Sunday

To celebrate Pentecost, please bring a flower from home to add to our communal bouquet. And wear RED for this special day!

Also, please come join us for coffee, tea, pastries and community. We hope to see you there.

Pentēkostē is Greek for "fiftieth", meaning it's the 50th day after Easter. Jewish people also have a feast 50 days after Passover, called "Shavuot", when they celebrate being given the Torah (the Law) and from then on become a people committed to loving and serving God. For Christians, we celebrate apostles receiving the Holy Spirit, and from then on become a group of people committed to loving and serving God, being witnesses to the ends of the earth. Because the color red is associated with Pentecost, we invite everyone to become part of our church environment and wear red on Pentecost Sunday.

When we say the Church celebrates "the Paschal Mystery" it's often briefly summarized as the Death of Jesus and the Resurrection of Jesus. In reality, the Paschal Mystery celebrates the Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus, and the Gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. All of these elements go together to form the core of Christian faith, and that's why they are fitting ways to end our 50 days of Easter celebration and joy.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!
