The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,

A few years ago, my former parish brought back Eucharistic Processions on The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The idea emerged from our Vietnamese Community. At first, I was hesitant to participate knowing we'd be processing as a community between our two Churches (a distance of 1.25 miles), trapsing through the city in alb and stole, carrying the Book of the Gospels, with a group of 100 or so parishioners. The Everett Police assist in closing intersections to traffic, so police cars with lights flashing would be present, adding to the spectacle. This public display of faith was not something I was comfortable with at the time. But as we did it, I found the experience internally transformational. We are called to evangelize Jesus (with family, friends, and neighbors), to not be afraid to share our faith in the public square, and to proudly be disciples of Jesus. This experience was transformative to our entire community, too, and a tradition that remains in Everett every year.
