# **Dear Sisters and Brothers In Christ,**

This week's Gospel reading is about how we handle rejection. It's a powerful message and one we can all learn from. But I would like to focus instead on this weekend's second reading this week from St. Paul's letter to the Galatians. Galatia was considered the hinterland, a backwater region with people who were not originally from the area. The Galatians were from Celtic Europe and settled in this barren wasteland just a few centuries before the time of Jesus. The early Christians who came to evangelize them instructed that it was a strict adherence to Jewish law, especially circumcision, that made you a Christian. Paul came to correct the record. The sign of being a good Christian is serving one another through love. "For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another." This tough love message stuck with the community, and it flourished. Love is all that matters. Not a strict adherence to rules and cultural practices. May we always practice what we preach.
