### How to Discontinue Online Giving At St. Pat's

A number of parishioners have asked recently asked how to discontinue financial offerings online. To do so please follow the steps below.

- Go to our St. Patrick Church website
- Hit the heading called "Online Giving" on the top right.
- This takes you to our Online Giving landing page. Hit either of the two pictures to go to the **OSV hub for our giving page**.
- Log into that page with your password, then hit the "My Gifts" words in the top bar. This will take you to the area that schedules recurring donations.
- Hit the stack of the three dots to the right of your monthly donation. There, you can update, pause or stop the gift.
- If you've forgotten your password, there is a way to recover it. Just follow the online instructions to get a new password.
