Dear Friend of St. Patrick's,

It's been four short months since Fr. Bryan and I were called to this wonderful community. What a blessing to serve such a beautiful parish and collaborate with so many gifted parishioners found here at St. Patrick Catholic Church.

There are so many amazing things we do here that are not done at other parishes in the Archdiocese. It's what draws you to our unique community. We don't just say "All Are Welcome." Here, we live it. And we do so in breathtaking and powerful ways.

In an effort to be fully transparent, this Annual Report will look back at the past year, contemplate the present situation, and take a glimpse at our future. At the present time, we do have our challenges. Attendance and giving are both down year-over-year, mostly due to the loss of one weekly Mass. But the truth is that giving is on a five-year downward trend, while expenses remain relatively flat when looked at over the past five-years. Our Finance Council approved a 2019-2020 budget with a slight surplus that resulted from an August bequest, otherwise, we would be operating with a deficit. The approval came with an expectation that together we can stabilize our financial condition and reinvigorate our financial commitment to St. Patrick. This is the challenging news.

The good news is that people who visit our community are taken aback by the beauty of our liturgy, the strength of our Christian witness, and our unique commitment to the deaf and special needs community. I believe one of the most remarkable aspects of St. Patrick is that we are the only parish community to build a weekly Mass (amazing music and liturgical movement) around its special needs community. Just like our friends at L'Arche who build community around its "core members," in much the same way we have built our unique community.

In the coming months, we will be looking at ways to better share the "good news" of our wonderful parish community with special needs families throughout the Seattle Archdiocese who may not be aware of our presence or are tired of feeling unwelcomed in their own parish. This should help us to grow our community and provide an even greater impact to Catholics in the Seattle Archdiocese.

Now is a good time to reflect on the successes and challenges of the past year and ask yourself what you can do to help us build a beautiful future together at St. Patrick Catholic Church.

FAST FINANCIAL FACTS

SUNDAY COLLECTIONS

Sunday Offerings totaled \$330,041, a decrease of \$6,908 over the previous fiscal year

SALARIES/BENEFITS

Wages and benefits for 2019/20 fiscal years are expected to increase by 26% due to leadership changes and cost sharing between St. Patrick and Christ Our Hope

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL REBATE

St. Patrick's rebate totaled \$8,310, which was used for the purchase and installation of a labyrinth.

PARISH SAVINGS

Parish savings totaling \$305,655 are in the Parochial Revolving Fund (PRF) at the Archdiocese of Seattle, where we earned an interest rate of 2.5%

ILEGAL ASSISTANCE FUND

A parishioner donation of \$98,000 was sent to a PRF savings account to establish a fund for refugee/asylum seeker legal fees. The parish made \$20,250 in payments to cover legal fees that benefited 7 individuals seeking asylum.

PROPERTY TAXES

St. Patrick's paid property taxes of \$4,900 on three properties.

NEIGHBORING SCHOOL SUBSIDY

2018/19 parish subsidy for neighboring schools was \$16,771; it is projected to be \$18,807 in 2019/20
