Supreme Courts lifts California ban on indoor church services.

Churches in California can open for indoor services after the U.S. Supreme Court overturned a state ban on indoor worship during the COVID-19 pandemic. In a 6-3 decision announced Friday night, the Court ruled in favor of two Southern California churches that had sued Gov. Gavin Newsom over the state's strict guidelines, which limited



churches to holding services outdoors or online. While the six justices in the majority differed over to what extent the state can restrict worship, all agreed that California's COVID-19 regulations violated the First Amendment's protections for free exercise of religion by treating churches unfairly that worship brings people together for too much time," wrote Justice Neil Gorsuch in an opinion of

"California worries that worship brings people together for too much time," wrote Justice Neil Gorsuch in an opinion concurring with the majority's Feb. 5 decision. "Yet, California does not limit its citizens to running in and out of other establishments; no one is barred from lingering in shopping malls, salons, or bus terminals." On Saturday, Gov. Newsom's office announced it would be releasing new guidelines on indoor worship in the coming days to conform with the new ruling. Indoor services had already been allowed in Los Angeles County since Dec. 19, when county health officials updated its own safety guidelines to allow for indoor services, despite the state ban. In that announcement, the county cited a similar ruling by the Supreme Court last November overturning New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo's restrictions on indoor worship in parts of Brooklyn. That decision argued that there are "many other less restrictive rules that could be adopted to minimize the risk to those attending religious services." "Even in a pandemic, the Constitution cannot be put away and forgotten," the court said. "The restrictions at issue here, by effectively barring many from attending religious services, strike at the very heart of the First Amendment's guarantee of religious liberty." U.S. Supreme Court justices Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh ruled against Gov. Gavin Newsom's ban on indoor religious services. Besides L.A. County, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles also comprises Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties. Until now, churches in those counties still had to comply with the state's indoor worship ban. But on Saturday, the Archdiocese notified employees that while "outdoor worship is still recommended," parishes in all three of the Archdiocese's counties "may offer indoor worship services limited to 25% of church capacity" in light of Friday's ruling. The Supreme Court's injunction concerned two different lawsuits against Gov. Gavin Newsom by Harvest Rock Church in Pasadena and South Bay United Pentecostal Church in Chula Vista. Eric Rassbach, vice president and senior counsel at the Becket religious liberty legal group, welcomed the decision. "California had no right to declare itself a religion-free zone," Rassbach said. "When every other state in the country has figured out a way to both allow worship and protect the public health, maybe you are doing it wrong. We are glad this extreme violation of our first freedom has finally come to an end." Becket had submitted an amicus brief in the case. "When it comes to First Amendment rights, courts should not rubber-stamp public health restrictions," said Rassbach. "That is especially so as we near the one-year anniversary of the lockdown orders. Instead, courts should carefully balance the right to worship and public health."

We are looking at ways that will allow us to return to our beautiful church as soon as possible. As stated above, the number of participants will be limited to 25% of capacity and all safety protocols will need to be enforced. We are currently awaiting new guidelines from the County of Los Angeles and the Archdiocese on how best to enact these changes.





Gospel Reading

Mark 1:40-45

Jesus cures a person with leprosy, who reports his cure to everyone.

Prayerfully Choose Compassion

Today's Gospel invites us to think about the choices we make as individuals and as a family. Jesus was faced with a choice in today's Gospel. By choosing to heal the man with leprosy, Jesus showed God's compassion for the sick and the outcast. The man knew that Jesus had a choice, and that Jesus could reject his request. He may have expected that Jesus would not help him. The social taboos regarding leprosy certainly gave him little on which to base his hope. In the person of the man with leprosy, we see an image of all those in need. The sick and the outcast of our world are watching us, to see if we as Christians will choose to extend ourselves to others in need of healing and compassion. Gather with your family and talk about some of the choices you have made as a family (where to go on vacation, what activities to do together, how to spend our evenings, and so on). How does your family go about making these decisions? What do your choices communicate to others about your family's values? In today's Gospel, Jesus was faced with a choice. Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:40-45. In choosing to heal the man with leprosy, Jesus chose to show God's compassion and mercy. All our choices reflect our faith, and others are watching. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help your family show compassion to others in your family decisions. Pray together today's Psalm, Psalm 32, or pray the Prayer for Vocations

Amen.



Life Teen message from Kelly Dunnahoo

Today's short second reading is taken from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. The context is that Paul is teaching the Corinthians that sometimes it is better to forgo something that is acceptable if it may lead someone else to sin. The larger context is we must always look out for the well-being of other people and put their needs in front of our own. It is through that love and sacrifice that we glorify God.

One thing that St. Paul was worried about here was the sin of scandal. Scandal is behaving in a way that may lead others to sin. The sin of scandal is particularly harmful because we potentially affect the salvation of others through our actions or inactions. It also can be a hard sin to recognize and requires some reflection to see how our actions impact others.



For example, it is easy to access and share immoral content on social media. It is everywhere. Ask yourself — can the content I share cause another to sin either in thought or action? Is the content in conflict with teachings of the Catholic Church? If people know I'm Catholic and I share such material am I teaching others that the teachings of the Church are irrelevant? A more difficult situation is where you are doing something that is not morally wrong at all, but it can easily be interpreted by a reasonable and fair person as being immoral. We must resist the temptation to cling to the popular idea that we shouldn't care what anyone else thinks. If our actions lead someone who is reasonable and fair to equate our Christianity with the acceptance of immorality, then we have done damage.

These ideas lead to the greater context of always looking out for others. Being a disciple of Christ comes with a responsibility. We are to lead others to Him through our words and actions. Therefore, we must step back and take a look at what we do and how we approach things. We must look at things through the eyes of others - the very people that we are trying to lead to Christ.

Of course, there are going to be times where we scandalize someone without knowing it. I have given countless talks to teenagers and participated in even more small-group discussions. Have there been times when I said or did something that may have negatively impacted their view on the Church or Church teachings? Undoubtedly. But over the years, I have prayed that God will enlighten me to those errors and that I would not do them again. You can do that too – ask God to help you avoid situations where you might lead someone else to sin. We have all heard the question, often asked in a negative way, "Am I my brother's keeper?" Well, the answer is...Yes you are.

Life Teen is a community for teenagers where we help each other, through support and prayer, to be intentional disciples and lead others to Christ.
