

### **SAINTS**

Thursday, April 8: Pope Francis delivered his blessing during his general audience in the library of the Apostolic Palace at the Vatican April 7, 2021. The Pope said Christians are never alone in prayer but instead are accompanied by countless saints who have preceded them. "Christians are never alone in prayer but instead are accompanied by myriad saints who protect them and seek God's intercession," Pope Francis said. Whenever men or women open their hearts to God, they will always be in the "company of anonymous and recognized saints who pray with us and who intercede for us as older brothers and sisters who have preceded us on this same human adventure," said the pope on April 7 during his



weekly general audience. Continuing his series of talks on prayer, the Pope reflected on the connection between prayer and the communion of saints who are "not far from us" and are a reminder of Jesus Christ because they have also "walked the path of life" as Christians. "In the Church, there is no mourning that remains solitary, no tear that is shed in oblivion, because everything breathes and participates in a common grace," he said. The tradition of having graveyards around churches is a sign of that sharing, he said. It is "as if to say that every Eucharist is attended in some way by those who have preceded us. There are our parents and grandparents, our godfathers and godmothers, our catechists and other educators," who have not only transmitted faith, but also "the way of praying." The saints, he explained, are "witnesses that we do not adore — that is understood, we do not worship these saints — but whom we venerate and who in thousands of different ways bring us to Jesus Christ, the only Lord and mediator between God and human beings." Departing from his prepared remarks, the pope said the lives of saints also serve as a reminder that "even in our lives, though weak and marked by sin, holiness can blossom." "In the Gospels, we read that the first 'canonized' saint was a thief and he was 'canonized' not by a pope, but by Jesus himself," he said. "Holiness is a path of life, of encounter with Jesus, whether long or short, or in an instant, but always a witness" of God's love. The Pope also highlighted the need for Christians to pray for one another, which is "the first way of loving" others. In times of tension, he said, "one way to dissolve the conflict, to soften it, is to pray for the person with whom I am in conflict. Something changes with prayer; the first thing that changes is my heart, my attitude. The Lord changes it to make an encounter possible, a new encounter, and prevents the



conflict from becoming a war without end." Pope Francis said the first thing people must do in times of anguish is to ask "our brothers and sisters, the saints above all, to pray for us" because they will "give us hand to obtain from God the graces we need most." Christians who "have not reached the breaking point" and persevere in times of trial perhaps owe it to the intercession of the saints who are not only in heaven, but also the holy men and women here on earth, the Pope added. "They don't know it, neither do we, but there are saints, everyday saints, hidden saints or as I like to say the 'saints next door,' those who live in life with us, who work with us, and lead a life of holiness," he said.

## OPERATIONS DIRECTOR JENNIFER CUMMINGS-MARTIN



We often act out of ignorance. Armed with the best of intentions, we think we are seeing clearly and correctly, but we are not. We don't always understand the full meaning of things and only

perceive part of the truth. Hence, our judgments and actions can be impaired by myopic, incomplete or erroneous perceptions. The meaning of life, understanding of human experience, and negotiating life's challenges can all become skewed without proper understanding and vision. The resurrection of Christ is the corrective to our incomplete and limited view of life. Looking at things with the eyes of faith brings a depth of clarity and understanding to how we see God, ourselves, others, and the world.

Even the disciples struggled with their limited understanding and ignorant perceptions. It was only when Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that their eyes were opened. It was their "aha" moment when everything clicked. We all want the substance of our lives to come together, make sense, and have meaning. This is easier to achieve when things are going positively, and life is good. It is when suffering, disappointment, death, hardship, and injustice enter the picture that things can become unsettled and disoriented. Our faith in the goodness and love of God is tested. We tend to shift our focus on these difficult and challenging moments and do not see them within the greater picture of how God intends life to unfold. We can gain, from the passion and resurrection of Christ, the clear vision we need in order to move away from ignorance to enlightenment.

We need our "aha" moment when everything comes together and clicks. It can come in a fleeting instant when we feel totally connected with God, where we find ourselves, others and all of creation. It is a moment when all is right and good, regardless of how difficult our journey. Our "aha" moment assures us that God is here, right with us, in us and around us bringing us a gift and blessing we can receive nowhere else: peace. In those brief sacramental encounters when we are lifted up out of ourselves and centered, we can hear God say, "peace be with you," and we feel secure. It's all okay. The resurrected Christ has the power to bring this gift to us. Some people, as they are facing their deaths, remark about this peace. When looking into the window of eternity, they experience a depth of joy and are amazed at God's goodness and closeness. We are called to be witnesses to this Good News.



## Sharing Stories and Sharing Meals Strengthens Our Love as a Family

Family life is strengthened through storytelling and shared mealtimes. In a similar way, Christian life is sustained by God's word in Scripture and by Christ's presence in the Eucharist. We are especially sustained in our faith through our weekly celebration of Mass. Today's Gospel reading reminds us that the Scripture and the Eucharist are given to us so that our acts of bearing witness to Christ might be strengthened. As you gather as a family, ask each person to share their favorite story about your family. Talk about the importance of these memories about your family life and the importance of the meals you have shared together as a family. Recall that these stories and meals strengthen the love you share. In a similar way, our Christian life is strengthened by sharing God's Word and the Eucharist at Mass. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 24:35-48. Discuss the mission that Jesus gave to his disciples after their shared meal. The Eucharist also sends us to be Christ's witnesses in the world today. Conclude by praying together that we will be strengthened by God's word and by

### Life Teen message from Kelly Dunnahoo

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus appears to His disciples and, quite frankly, scares them. They knew that He had been killed – everyone in Jerusalem knew this! But sure enough, here He was, with the wounds still on His body. After having a bite to eat with them, He proceeded to explain all of the Old Testament prophecies that pointed to His coming as the Messiah.

The Old Testament books are the Scriptures that the Jewish people used. These books were written by various prophets and Kings of Israel and are inspired by God, just like the rest of the Bible. They cover important things related to how God has prepared His people for salvation and life with Him, up until just a couple of centuries before Jesus came.

A lot of people skip over these important books of the Bible because, honestly, they can sometimes be hard to read — with unusual names, odd rules and customs, and a mistaken notion on the part of the reader that they aren't relevant a nymore. But that can't be farther from the truth! Well, OK, the names are difficult, and the rules and customs may be hard to fathom, but the Old Testament writings are extremely relevant to our faith. We hear a reading from the Old Testament (and selections from the Psalms) every Sunday Mass (except for the few weeks after Easter). If they weren't important, they wouldn't be included in the Mass.

The Old Testament has a large number of prophecies that point to Jesus as the Messiah. The question then is why didn't the Jews at the time realize this and follow Christ? A main reason is that they didn't have the Holy Spirit to guide them. Also, their understanding of what the Messiah was going to be like clouded their understanding. They thought the Messiah was going to come down, take care of the Romans, and rule on earth. They weren't looking for a Messiah who preached love and repentance.



While Isaiah and the Psalms have a large number of these prophecies, here are a couple of more obscure examples:

Micah 5:1 indicates that a ruler whose "origin is from ancient times" will be born in Bethlehem.

I hope you will explore the Books of the Old Testament, especially the Prophets, on your own and see the connections for yourselves.

Amos 8:9 indicates that the land would be covered by darkness starting at noon as described in Matthew 27:45.
