Dear Parish Family,

I hope everyone had a wonderful celebration of Independence Day! It is exciting to think that next year will be the 250th anniversary of the nation! I can clearly remember the Bicentennial of 1976 when I was nine years old. We'll see if I can make it to 109 for the Tricentennial! I remember many years ago I was with Fr. Raja who arrived here on July 4th to help us for the months of July and August. We observed an older lady pushing a stroller with a little dog, obviously very pampered, inside. Fr. Raja started laughing and I asked him what was so funny. He said "There is a joke in India: people say they hope when they die they can come back as a dog in America". It is very easy especially for us who are born here to slip into taking for granted all the blessings we have. We can focus on current problems, and certainly there are many, but lose sight of the Big Picture. Traveling is also a great way to increase our appreciation for the blessings and advantages we enjoy here, but because of geography and economic reality, most Americans don't ever leave the country — less than 50% have a valid passport.

Even with our challenges and divisions we currently struggle with, there is a generosity of spirit, past and present, in the American character. I think of my family and the service they gave in World War II and beyond. One of my grandfathers was certified as a bombardier, pilot, and navigator in the bombers that flew missions out of England over Germany. During the Battle of the Bulge, his plane was shot down and half his crew did not survive. He dedicated the next part of his career to serving the needs of veterans in the Veterans Administration. My other grandfather was a pilot on the Berlin Airlift which was also a very dangerous mission. I've passed on letters to my brother that my grandfather received from German school children thanking him for his help to sustain their families. One of my great uncles was part of the Bataan Death March and was a POW in Japan for three years. And more recently my brother served in the Army for twenty years, doing two tours in Iraq and one in Afghanistan. Much of our nation's military action and sacrifice has been in the service of others, not only protecting our own freedoms, but also directly helping other people around the world. When we are tempted to focus on the negative and perhaps feel a little down about our country, let's try to keep in mind all that we have accomplished thus far in our short history, for ourselves and all the world. As I was writing this I was thinking how history can so easily be lost over time. How many people today can even identify such events as the Battle of the Bulge, Bataan Death March, or Berlin Airlift? One of our weaknesses seems to be that Americans in general are often not too focused on history or knowledge of the world around us. We should all do our part to stay optimistic and preserve and share all the legacy of good the world, and us in particular, enjoy thanks to the blessing of our nation.

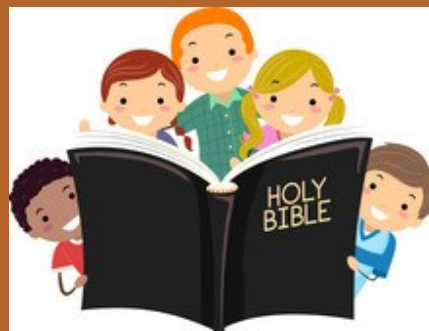

Did You Know?

Summer and Water Safety at Home

While parents are often hyper vigilant around pools and lakes, drowning can happen at home in an instant, especially with very young children. This summer, watch children around water at home, including buckets, containers, and kiddie pools. Children can drown in as little as an inch of water, so constant supervision is necessary.
