

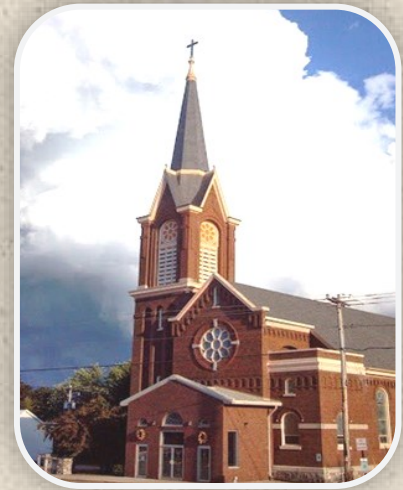

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK OUR LADY'S APPARITION MESSAGE OCTOBER 9, 1859

On the occasion of the 164th Apparition Anniversary of Our Lady to Adele Brise in Champion, Wisconsin and Solemn Inaugural Solemnity of Our Lady of Champion, I encourage everyone to prayerfully reflect on Our Lady's Apparition Message.

Falling to her knees, Adele asked, "In God's name, who are you, and what do you want of me?"

Mary - "I am the Queen of Heaven who prays for the conversion of sinners, and I wish you to do the same. You received

Holy Communion this morning and that is well. But you must do more. Make a general confession and offer Communion for the conversion of sinners. If they do not convert and do penance, my Son will be obliged to punish them."

Adele's companions, unable to see Our Lady asked, "Adele, who is it? Why can't we see her as you do? "Kneel," said Adele, "the Lady says she is the Queen of Heaven."

Mary - The Blessed Lady gazed kindly upon them, saying, "Blessed are they that believe without seeing." Then, looking toward Adele, the Queen of Heaven asked, "What are you doing here in idleness while your companions are working in the vineyard of my Son?"

"What more can I do, dear Lady?" asked Adele, weeping.

Mary - "Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

"But how shall I teach them who know so little myself?" said Adele.

Mary - "Teach them," replied her radiant visitor, "their catechism, how to sign themselves with the sign of the Cross, and how to approach the sacraments; that is what I wish you to do. Go and fear nothing, I will help you."
