FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The strategy of Jesus for realizing his ideal of the kingdom of heaven on earth is to employ his followers to proclaim the saving activity of God. It is worth noting that even though time is pressing and the loss of the harvest of souls is imminent, Christ urges his disciples not just to fling themselves headlong into activity but to pray that the Lord of the harvest will help them in their work.

In prayer we come to better appreciate the seriousness of sin, the value of God's mercy and the magnitude of his love for sinners. Only through prayer can we share the life of Christ in the unique way the apostles did.

As Christians it is our task to continue the work of Christ. Only with our words can he speak to people and alert them of the nearness of the kingdom. It is with our preaching that he encourages conversion by pointing out the availability of salvation. In the midst of trials, when we look upon human problems with understanding hearts, we bring his encouragement showing that even in the midst of

trouble there is one who cares. We preach Christ's message best by reflecting his values in our own lives - actions supplement words and express more fully the



genuineness and honesty of what we say. If we are good advertisements for the church, the many non-believers with whom we come in contact may go a step further and discover Christ as a result. It is no small challenge to be Christ's messenger as it demands great effort and hard work.
