

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Third Sunday of Lent

In the Gospel of John 2:13-25, we witness Jesus cleansing the Temple in Jerusalem with fervent zeal. This episode is not just a historical account but a vibrant call to action for all parishioners today. It invites us to reflect on the sanctity of our communal worship spaces and the purity of our personal involvement within our parish community.

As Jesus enters the Temple and finds it desecrated by commercial activities, His actions speak volumes about the respect and reverence we owe to our places of worship. The Temple, meant to be a house of prayer, had lost its sacred essence to worldly transactions. This Lent,

participation in the parish, therefore, is not just about maintaining the physical space but about building the Body of Christ, a community of believers dedicated to living out the Gospel.

This Lent, let us respond to Jesus' call with renewed zeal. May we deepen our commitment to our parish not only as a place of worship but as a vibrant community where we actively contribute our time, talents, and treasures. In doing so, we honor Jesus' sacrifice and reflect His love and zeal for God's house in our lives.
