# THE ALMOST FAMOUS FATHER BRIAN PILGRIMAGE RETREAT DAY 2025: "DOORWAYS TO HOPE" WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25, 2025

Every year since 2015, I have arranged a day pilgrimage at every parish I have been pastor. Each pilgrimage is unique with a special theme. No two trips are the same. This year's theme is Doorways to Hope. A pilgrimage consists of a group of believers journeying together united in Christ with the intention of deepening Faith in Jesus and relationships with one another. Our group forms a unique family and fosters lasting friendships. You will absolutely enjoy this experience. We will even have fun! You will not want to miss this impressive event that will become highly anticipated in years to come.

The "Doorways" will include a tour of Hearthstone Historic House Museum, the first home in Wisconsin to feature electricity. We will visit St. Pius X parish in Appleton, which is one of three designated pilgrimage sites for the Jubilee year of Hope and was Fr. Brian's first priestly assignment. We will

learn of a humble Capuchin porter (doorkeeper) Blessed Solanus Casey and his unique vocation to religious life and priesthood. We will pass through the door of the newly renovated St. Mary's, Menasha.



We will celebrate Mass, pray the rosary, and have some surprises along the way. Supper will be at Good Company where we will also hear a short story of their fascinating history.

Pre-Registration is required. There is a 52-person limit and seats are claimed first come, first serve. This event will fill up fast, so don't miss out on a beautiful day of prayer, community, and fun. Cost: \$80 per person. \$75 if you register on or before MONDAY, May 5.

#### **BISHOP'S APPEAL**



Over 30 years ago, as I began discerning priesthood, I was invited on a seminarian retreat. That retreat was 100% paid for by the Diocese.

As I began studying for the priesthood at Mundelein Seminary, I was gifted with four wonderful years of seminary formation at no cost to me. In 2012, I had the privilege to study canon law and earn an advanced degree (called a JCL) from the Catholic University of America. That too, was a gift.

Going on twenty years of priesthood this year, I have been blessed to have been able to be part of lay ministry and diaconate formation as an instructor. I have taught courses in ecclesiology, Old Testament, and canon law to over 100 people seeking to know the Lord better to serve Him and His Holy Church. Those one hundred people, some of whom you may know, were able to grow as disciples, free of charge.

When I was serving at St. John the Evangelist parish in Green Bay, I met a wonderful group of people: the deaf community. They called the parish home because Masses were interpreted for them so they could participate as part of the community. In most years, 90 – 100% of the costs of that ministry were reimbursed to the parish by Catholic Charities.

I am grateful to the Diocese of Green Bay and Bishop Ricken for his support throughout the years. Without your generosity the diocese could not support and maintain the Church's mission in the diocese. It is through your generosity that the light of Christ shines brightly in our parishes. In a round-about-way, it is through your generosity that I have been sent here as your pastor.

I am grateful and thankful for the continual support that I have and continue to receive. That is why I continue to support the annual Bishop's Appeal. My contribution shows that I am grateful and also on board. It is also my way of giving back for

#### **CEMETERY PLOTS PRICE INCREASE**

Burying the dead is a Corporal Work of Mercy that involves the generous stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. It is essential that the cemetery be well maintained now and in the future.



Effective July 1, 2025, the cost per grave plot will increase from \$500 to \$800 for parish members, and from \$800 to \$1500 for non-parishioners.

The last increase in cemetery rates occurred in 2003. Most of the revenue needed for general maintenance and upkeep is generated directly from plot sales. Additionally, it is necessary to ensure proper maintenance long after our current ceme-

tery space is full.

Look at the cost of a burial space as an investment into the future maintenance and beautification of our cemetery. Twenty-five percent of the purchase price for each plot is designated for perpetual care, which is a fund from which the growing principle can never be used.

I am proud to be the sexton of St. James Cemetery to which I have a personal connection. Over the past few years, I have taken the initiative to make many needed improvements to our aging cemetery. We have scheduled spring and fall clean up days, Many headstones have been cleaned, repaired, and straightened. Sunken graves have been leveled, and we had water lines run to

the back of the cemetery. Much of the maintenance, (minus the lawn cutting and the opening and closing of graves) is handled by volunteers. However, there are always equipment and other charges that cost money.

#### KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS by Jim Wavrunel

The Knights of Columbus were established by Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney in 1882. He had the vision and foresight to conceive an organization which would provide Catholic men the opportunity to live their faith through charitable works, caring for their families and defending the Catholic Faith.

Denmark Council #4735 has 160 members. Many of them serve their parishes as lectors, communion distributors, ushers, choir members, committee members and other roles. Last year the Denmark Knights donated \$96,000.00. Here are a few of their recent contributions:

- They helped to support St. James Church with donations for such things as the parking lot, altar necessities, a new phone system for the offices, mass server robes, and the dinner and dance fundraiser. Their outreach extended to Fr. Santy with the Filipino disaster relief, and the Coats for Kids drive.
- The 40 Days for Life Campaign. The Knights of Columbus are prol-ife.

- ◆ The local food pantry.
- Five \$500 scholarships annually to high school seniors who will attend an accredited 4-year college or an accredited 2-year technical college.
- ◆ They have formed a partnership with All Saints

School to promote Catholic Education in Denmark and the surrounding parishes.

- ♦ Our Tootsie Roll Drive has given over \$37,500 to aid citizens with intellectual disabilities in Denmark since 1987.
- ◆ An Annual Golf outing at Wander Springs Golf Course helps a local family in need. Last year we supported the Frank Horkman Family with a donation of \$53,000.
- Through our booyah sales, we gave \$500 each to 16 seminarians last year and since 2011, we have donated \$71,000 to young men studying for the priesthood.


