FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. The Body and Blood of the Lord – The second celebration after Pentecost is known as the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord. Ancient Christianity (Latin or Greek) considers the celebration of the Eucharist as the central act of worship for Christians. Both East and West believe that Jesus Christ is truly present, body and blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist we receive. I often think that this is the chief way Jesus wants to share his love and presence with us. And when we don't attend weekly Mass, we miss out receiving this wonderful sacrament that nourishes and strengthens our faith and our commitment to Jesus and His Way. Let's pray for a new realization of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and resolve to receive him at least weekly at Mass.

2. 8th Grade and High School graduation – I know you'll join me in offering congratulations and best wishes to our Grade school and High School students graduating this year. We wish them well as they go into the future, and pray that they will always remember that we love them, appreciate them, and want very much for them to succeed in this life, and of course, in the next!

3. BAA – We are off to a good start with the BAA here at St. Christopher. Thus far, we have pledged \$55,267.01 to help us reach our goal of \$71,726.90. As I said last week, one of my goals this year is to bring up the percentage of participation. Only a little more than 25% of our parish participate in this annual fund drive. It goes without saying that the obligation to support the church, which includes the diocese, should be borne by more than 25% of the congregation. In these days when parishes are closing and being combined with others, the financial sustainability of each parish becomes an important determinate in their continued existence. St. Christopher is in no danger of closing because of finances. However, we need not only get by; we need to prosper. We cannot do this without your generosity. Too few have carried the burden for too long. I ask each family or wage earner to consider making a pledge of **\$600.00**. Some can afford much more, some much less. But the important thing is participation. Christian maturity involves taking responsibility for the support of the parish church as well as the diocesan church. I will be saying more about this in the near future. It has been my experience that whenever a new pastor arrives, the collections drop significantly. I've had to go through this four times myself in each of my four pastorates. This predictable drop in collections is regrettable, deplorable, inexcusable, and disappointing. I will not hesitate to prepare for a new pastor without preparing all of you to welcome him and support him, which includes support of the church. We not only owe that to him, but to the Lord Jesus who sends us a new pastor to provide us with the spiritual leadership we all need. More on this later!

4. Good-bye Deacon David Loeffler – Our deacon from the Josephinum this year will be leaving us soon. As is our custom for the past few years, we'd like to take up a collection as a parting gift from us, and symbolic of our prayer and gratitude for his ministry among us this past year. I will be attending Deacon David's ordination in Phoenix in mid-June and want to present him with our gift in gratitude for his service here.

5. Year of Mercy – Our Holy Father, Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with

one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

Corporal Works of Mercy:**Feed the hungry****Give drink to the thirsty****Clothe the naked****Shelter the homeless****Visit the sick****and imprisoned****Bury the dead****Spiritual Works of Mercy****Admonish sinners****Counsel the doubtful****Bear wrongs patiently****Pray for the living and the dead****Instruct the uninformed****Comfort the sorrowful****Forgive offenses**

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

6. Evangelization – Bring a friend or family member to Church!

– Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!

7. Memorial Day – Our Country provides this holiday for us to remember the faithful departed, especially those who have died in defense of our Country. Let us remember them not only by visiting their graves and decorating them with flowers, but also may our prayers for the peaceful repose of their souls accompany our celebrations on this coming Monday. May we always remember them and thank God for the generosity of their sacrifices for us.


