**FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY**

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. **Thanks for the memories** – Well folks – this is it! I've had the privilege of being your pastor for a little longer than twelve years, and now it is time for me to retire. During Mass one day this week, I reflected on retirement and I don't think any other pastor retired from here. I know that Fr. Culliton and Fr. Wiles passed away here, but I believe the rest of the pastors were re-assigned. So, if I'm right on this, I'm the first one to retire! As I look back on my 43 years of priesthood and four pastorates, I thank God for a happy and blessed ministry. This is said many times but it's true: I feel I got more from my parishioners than I gave them – I've been edified and amazed by the depth of faith, sacrifice and heroism I've noticed in many of you over the years, and that is very true of this parish. I feel I owe a debt of gratitude to all of you for your friendship and your great example of faith and generosity. Where am I going? As you know, from the Catholic Times, the Bishop has reappointed me Judicial Vicar for the Diocese. This position I will occupy until Fr. Bob Kittsmiller, newly returned from canon law studies, can take over the job of Judicial Vicar. He's the future, I'm the past! However, I intend to keep working part-time on the Tribunal as long as I still have all of my "marbles." I'll be at my home parish of St. Michael, but I also want to be available to help out where I am needed. With all of the one-man parishes in our Diocese, there are times when a priest is needed in an emergency for Sunday Mass. I'll still be around town, and if Fr. Poliafico (he prefers to be called Fr. David) ever needs me to fill in for him I'd be more than happy to do so – I do know my way around the sacristy! Before I go, I feel the need also to apologize if I have ever hurt, offended, or caused any scandal by my speech or behavior. I'm well aware of my human frailty, and know the need to ask forgiveness. I hope that in the generosity of your hearts, you will forgive me. On my part, I bear no ill will toward anyone at St. Christopher, only a sense of gratitude and thanks! Here's my new home address: **173 Charleston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43214**. Goodbye for now – thanks to you always! God bless! Welcome Fr. David with open arms and hearts!
2. **Our new pastor, Fr. David Poliafico:** (pronounced – puh-LIF-ee-ko). Fr. David is originally from Parma, Ohio and I met him when he was a resident in our house of formation that used to be on Neil Avenue, in St. Francis Parish, where I was pastor for 12 years. Dave attended St. Francis, played the trumpet at Mass occasionally, and became a friend of mine. St. Francis was his Columbus parish, and I was honored to host his First Mass at the Church before he left to have another Mass at his parish in Parma. He is a wonderful person and I couldn't have done a better job if I had chosen him myself! I'll be meeting with him and he will be meeting with the staff to ease his transition here, as well as to ease my departure from St. Christopher. Welcome, Fr. David!
3. **Year of Mercy** – Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be a hardhearted lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere,

"Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

**Corporal Works of Mercy:**

<b>Feed the hungry</b>	<b>Shelter the homeless</b>
<b>Give drink to the thirsty</b>	<b>Visit the sick and imprisoned</b>
<b>Clothe the naked</b>	<b>Bury the dead</b>

**Spiritual Works of Mercy**

<b>Admonish sinners</b>	<b>Instruct the uninformed</b>
<b>Counsel the doubtful</b>	<b>Comfort the sorrowful</b>
<b>Bear wrongs patiently</b>	<b>Forgive offenses</b>
<b>Pray for the living and the dead</b>	

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

4. **Evangelization – bring a friend or family member to Church!** – Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us to get them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!


