





#### Ask the Padre...

Question: Will we pray the Rosary Month of July?

YES! Actually we have already been Answer: praying the Rosary, Tue - Saturday, 30 minutes before Mass since Covid-19 begun. We will continue to do so through June and beyond.

#### Question: Is the Capital Campaign Extension over now?

**Answer:** Due to the spike in Covid-19 and the Economic downturn of January 2022, the 1-Year Extension was put on hold. To date we have already collected over \$330,000 in pledges. We have received permission from Bishop Paprocki to re-engage this extension from Now (April 2023) until December 2023. The 1-Year Extension Goal Range is \$660,000 to \$1 million. Ideally we need about \$450,000 in addition to the \$330,000 already pledged.



St. Agnes Parishioners MISSION were able to raise a total of \$3,541.00 during the APPEAL Mission Appeal Weekend held June 24/25.

In 2007, Pope Benedict wrote his postsynodal Apostolic Exhortation on the Eucharist as the "source and summit of the Church's life and mission." The title. Sacramentum caritatis. means: "The Sacrament of Charity (Love)" - because through the Eucharist Christ gives himself

to us as gift, revealing God's love for every person (SC #1). In it, he reflected on the Eucharist as a mystery to be believed, celebrated, and lived.

#### Mystery

When we say that the Eucharist is a "mystery" we're not saying that it's a puzzle that needs solving, or something like a "whodunit" on TV. Nor does it mean that it's something we can't understand so we should just not bother. No, "mystery" in the way we're using it here means "something that has such depth and richness of meaning that, while it can be experienced, it can never be fully comprehended or explained."

#### Lex orandi, Lex credendi, Lex vivendi

This is a shorthand way of saying that the way we pray and worship (*lex orandi*) expresses our faith (*lex credendi*); and what we pray and believe ought to be reflected in how we live (lex vivendi). In other words, what we believe, celebrate, and live are all interconnected. Part of Christian spirituality is seeking to integrate these three parts of who we are more and more, rather than living fragmented lives.
