





Ask the Padre...

Our Annual Parish Financial Report will be THIS WEEKEND Sep 30 / Oct 1 at each Mass. A full report will then be mailed to each registered member of the parish.



Question: How did the Finance Council reach our weekly collection goal total?

Answer: The Finance Council has addressed differentiating the Weekly Collection Goal from the Weekly Budget Goal. These are two different but related goals. The total budget income includes: School Tuition, Fundraisers such as Scrip and the Auction, the Tuition Assistance Envelope as well as the Annual School Fund, Empowering IL AND the Weekly Collections. The past few years the Weekly Collection Goal has been based upon the past year's actual collection plus a 3% to 5% increase.

<u>Conclusion</u>: Wednesday, September 6, our Finance Council met to answer this as well as many other questions. The simple answer is \$23,000 is our Weekly Goal for this fiscal year. Remember, our Weekly Collection Goal is only one of many sources of income for our total parish Operating Budget.

The Finance Council will continue to diligently monitor our Parish Finances and will begin a quarterly update in this bulletin.


