

Reflection with Fr. Christopher

Friends, after the excitement and solemnity of Christmas and the New Year, we begin a short period of Ordinary Time. Lent is only a month away(!), with Ash Wednesday falling on February 14th (Sorry, St. Valentine!). Whatever your thoughts may be on New Year's resolutions, it's not too early for us to begin thinking about our Lenten resolutions.

On New Year's Eve, I had the joy of gathering in South Bend, Indiana with a large group of friends from around the Midwest. We rang in the New Year in a different way: we celebrated Mass and had an extended time of praise and intercessory prayer. Several of my friends who are very Spirit-filled people have been sensing in prayer that the Lord is calling the Church in 2024 to purity of heart. Fittingly, they see Psalm 24 as a kind of "theme Psalm" for 2024. This Psalm highlights purity of heart as a condition for us to encounter the Lord and receive His blessings:

Who may go up the mountain of the Lord?
Who can stand in his holy place?
"The clean of hand and pure of heart,
who has not given his soul to useless things, what is vain.
He will receive blessings from the Lord,
and justice from his saving God.
Such is the generation that seeks him,
that seeks the face of the God of Jacob" (Ps 24:3–6)

Purity of heart is all about putting God in the first place in our lives so that everything else can be a blessing but not a distraction. Of course, it's always a good time to pray for this purity and to pursue it, but I for one am making this my primary resolution for 2024 (and Lent in a particular way). Whatever your own resolutions may be, we can all benefit from asking God, "Lord, what useless or vain things are distracting me from you and what is most important in my life?" We want to be the "generation that seeks Him," so that He can bless us and make us a blessing to others.




