MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear St. Agnes School Parents,

A belated Happy Mardi Gras to all of you. Tuesday was a sea of purple, gold, and green as we had one last big “hurrah” before the beginning of Lent. Many, many thanks to all of the room parents who provided wonderful games and treats for the carnival celebration. You could hear many squeals of delight throughout the building from all of the fun. It’s hard to believe that the end of the year parties are the final celebrations left this school year. Before we know it, May will be here!! Time certainly flies by quickly!!!

We’ve also had some fluctuating weather as of late with temperatures in the 30’s some days and other days in the 50’s. Please recall, the students will be going outdoors for recess on most days when the weather is appropriate to do so. As a reminder, when the temperature warrants, please make sure that your child is properly attired for the outside - coats, hats, scarves, gloves, etc. Thank you!

Current Family Re-registration

On Monday of this week families of students who are currently enrolled in grades Pre-K 3 thru 7 received packets with re-registration forms for the 2024-2025 school year. **If you are planning on having your child(ren) return to St. Agnes School next school year, it will be necessary for you to return your re-registration forms, tuition payment preference form, and School Family Agreement, along with your registration fee of \$150.00 per family, by Thursday, February 29.** Also, if you have younger children that you will be enrolling in St. Agnes School next year, please list their names and grades on your family’s re-registration form. New student registration forms will be available Monday, March 4, 2024.

Mass Attendance Update

On Tuesday of this week, a Mass Attendance update (along with a Service Hour update) was sent home with your youngest/only child. This was to inform you of your progress, thus far, of attendance at weekend Masses. Please recall that our practicing Catholic families are being asked to attend Mass 51% of the time throughout a twelve-month period. Official tracking of this began September 1, 2023, a bit later than we anticipated, because of the late arrival of church offertory envelopes. In the percentage calculation on these statements, families were given credit for Masses that they attended and turned in envelopes in July and August 2023, also. Preschool only families, other faith tradition families, and those who are of the Catholic faith but attend another parish were not included in this Mass attendance count so these families’ statements do not reflect this. Mass attendance will continue to be counted through July 31, 2024 for the 2023-2024 school year and will begin August 1, 2024 for the 2024-2025 school year. Those Catholic parishioner families and those who are registered in another Catholic parish and are attending Mass 51% of the year will be assessed the “Catholic Parishioner” tuition rate for the 2024-2025 school year. St. Agnes Parish staff will contact the parishes of those registered in another Catholic parish for those attendance numbers. Those families who do not meet this percentage will be assessed the “Other Faith Traditions” tuition rate next school year. School family Mass attendance has shown an upward trend and this is greatly appreciated. Thank you for your commitment to your child(ren)’s Catholic faith.

Kindergarten Screenings for 2024-2025

Current Preschool 4-year-old families enrolling their child in kindergarten will have the opportunity to sign up for a kindergarten screening time through the on-line "My Conference Time" system. More information regarding the sign up will be sent to you on Monday, March 4. Mrs. Steinkruger, our kindergarten teacher, will be conducting screenings on Friday, March 22. Those students in our Preschool 4-year-old classroom who will be continuing on to kindergarten at St. Agnes School will be escorted by school staff to the kindergarten classroom that day and will be screened. Parents need not be in attendance for this.

Family Service Hours

As I stated at the beginning of this newsletter, the school year is certainly flying by quickly!! Remember, each family is required to complete 20 hours of service per school year. You may submit your service hours on the Service Hour Google Form located on our school website. Statements regarding your service hour status were sent home with the youngest/only child on Tuesday of this week.

SCRIP Program

The Parents' Club SCRIP program ends April 30th for this school year. On May 1st, the program begins anew for the following school year. Remember that 40% of what is earned as profit goes to you to be applied to school expenses. The other 60% is used by the Parents' Club for their activities. Parents who have not fulfilled commitments will be asked to pay the buyout.

ABSENTEES

Each parent/guardian is required to notify the school office if a child will be absent that day. Homework requests may be made at this time for absences. Parents should call the school office prior to 8:30a.m. and may leave a message on the school answering machine if the secretary cannot be reached. An email may also be sent to Pam Kink, School Secretary (pkink@stagnescatholicsschool.org). **A call or email should be made each day the student is absent, unless it is known that the child will miss several consecutive days.** If such is the case, the school can be informed with the first phone call/email of the consecutive absence and the reason.

LATE ARRIVALS & EARLY DISMISSALS

Each parent/guardian is required to notify the school office if a child will be arriving late or leaving early for an appointment. A **written note in advance of the appointment** is to be sent to the school office through the teacher for the release of a student from school for doctor, dental or other appointments. Emails may be sent to the teacher and to Mrs. Pam Kink (pkink@stagnescatholicsschool.org) as well. **If your child will be arriving late please indicate if he/she is a hot or cold lunch when contacting the school.** **A parent must personally pick up the child at the school office.** **A student must check in at the school office upon returning from an appointment to get an admit slip to return to class.**

GUIDANCE – Mrs. LaFata

HOW SOCIAL MEDIA IS MAKING KIDS GROW UP TOO FAST: Many parents feel like their children are growing up too fast with the help of social media. Platforms like TikTok, Instagram and YOUTUBE give kids access to endless information and content. Kids today know more, but they are also at risk of encountering ideas that affect the speed of their psychological and social development. Some of the things they see aren't necessarily harmful but the biggest concern is how to ensure your kids are interacting with content that is age-appropriate. A few examples of what kids are exposed to on social media and how it can cause them to skip stages of their growth: **Risky behavior;** since the prefrontal cortex is the last to mature, your child's emotional and impulsive regions are still developing, which means they may have higher impulsivity and lower ability to weigh potential risks carefully; While influencers can be grown adults who know the consequences of their actions, kids may put themselves in unnecessarily risky situations for the thrill and excitement they see online. **Makeup and fashion;** younger children are learning how to do their makeup and may want to dress according to adult fashion trends, this may make kids feel they must alter their appearance to be considered beautiful. **Eating disorders;** anyone can post about their exercise or eating habits and it isn't always healthy. While these posts might be helpful to adults it could pose health risks to kids still developing their bodies. **Comparison;** constant exposure to content depicting success, beauty and happiness may make kids feel their lives are less than others. The pressure to live up to unrealistic standards for online validation may contribute to adolescent body image issues, low self-esteem and anxiety. **Mature content;** the more kids are active online without limits to what they see, the more they will encounter inappropriate content in the form of violent videos, suggestive imagery and music, and adult jokes

HOW TO FOSTER HEALTHY SOCIAL MEDIA USE: Support your kids by teaching them to think critically about what they are seeing. The best thing you can do is review your kid's social media accounts and access them occasionally. Be transparent and create a safe and open space to discuss what they see. Help them to develop good habits that support their mental and emotional growth. It is important to limit screen time! Too much screen time can affect their mental health. Encourage alternate activities that involve no technological devices. 

Program Fee & Financial Assistance

We believe that building confidence and setting young girls down the path of a healthy lifestyle are priceless! However, there are real costs associated with delivering the Girls on the Run program to over 1,000 girls per year.

The program fee is **\$150 per girl**. This amount is subsidized by sponsors of Girls on the Run of Central Illinois, meaning the cost of providing programming and operating our nonprofit is greater than the program fee (approximately \$205 per girl).

What is included in the fee?

- Twenty practice sessions facilitated by certified GOTR volunteer coaches
- Curriculum and lesson materials
- Official GOTR Program T-shirt
- 5K Registration Fee
- 5K Finisher's Medal
- Post 5K Celebration

How to Apply for Financial Assistance - NEW PROCESS

We are proud to honor our commitment that no girl is ever turned away for the inability to pay the registration fee; therefore, we offer financial assistance (scholarships) using a sliding scale based on household income.



Household Income Guidelines	Sliding Scale Fee
Under \$25,000	\$25
\$25,001 - \$35,000	\$35
\$35,001 - \$50,000	\$50
\$50,001 - \$75,000	\$75
\$75,001 - \$100,000	\$100
Over \$100,000 (or decline to state)	\$150

The financial assistance process is now included within the online program registration. To use financial assistance, simply answer the questions during registration, and the computer will determine your eligibility based on household income and adjust the fee accordingly. If you need assistance beyond where your family falls in the above chart, please email darian@GOTRcentralillinois.org with information on your specific circumstances and what amount you can afford. Our minimum fee for any participant is \$25.

Payment Plans Available

Program fees can be paid in multiple installments. **Two- or three-month payment plan options are available to every family regardless of whether financial assistance is needed.** You can choose your preferred payment plan during the online program registration.
