



# From the Desk of our Pastor



## I hope you had a great Divine Mercy week

Two weeks have passed since our Easter celebration. How is Easter present in your life? Have you seen and touched the Resurrected Christ? We are an Easter people. We are Christ's Church. We stand on that first young community that came together on the strength of faith and witness. What they had, what held them together, is what we have – a new life in the risen Lord. Because of the resurrection, we live differently on Easter Sunday, Mercy Sunday, on this Sunday, and on every day of our lives. May each of us be the witness of that new life. **Be Bold. Be Holy. Be Catholic.**

### Getting Ready for 65

Easter provides a new opportunity for us to come out from behind our locked doors, from behind whatever is keeping us from speaking out on our faith. Look around and ask yourself, "who's missing? Who's not here who should be here? Who got left at home? Who didn't get invited?" Maybe it's a son or a daughter and you're just tired of arguing with them about how boring Mass is? Maybe it's a husband or wife who has given up on their faith? Perhaps it's a close friend who is putting "their conditions" on their beliefs? Tell them that Christ will meet their conditions and do whatever is necessary to bring them to faith. Tell them what you've seen here—that ordinary bread and wine becomes Christ himself; that a community of people, that mixture of saints and sinners come together bringing all of their own doubts and fears, struggles, and tensions, in the most powerful sign that Christ is risen and alive. It is the Lord who calls us together and sustains us and loves us – just as he loved those first disciples through their ups and downs.

The 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the dedication of our church building celebrated this month on the 29<sup>th</sup> at 10 am Mass is that opportunity to invite, to witness, to be messengers of God's mercy. Every household within our parish boundaries has been invited to our celebration by way of a special invitation mailed to them. Reach out, invite them too and join us. Let it be the celebration of Thanksgiving. **Be Bold.**

## STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS – 3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The themes linked in today’s Scripture readings call for us to avoid sin by following the Lord’s directives, to repent, and to seek forgiveness. St. Peter, in the Acts of the Apostles, relates the evil of Christ’s passion and death, and that through repentance and conversion, *our sins be wiped away*. St. John, in his First Letter, reminds us that Jesus is an offering for our sins. In St. Luke’s Gospel, Jesus appears to His disciples after His Resurrection while two of them recount their encounter with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. They finally recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. The Church has long taught that partaking of the Eucharist forgives lesser sins. Likewise, participating in the sacrament of Reconciliation for the forgiveness of sins opens us to Christ’s grace, bringing us closer to Him, giving us peace in our lives. This week, go to confession and receive Holy Communion to draw into union with Christ.

Are you ready to do some spring cleaning? St. Vincent de Paul would LOVE to have those gently used items that are taking up space in your home! That's ten days for you to clean your closets, dig through your cabinets, and take stock of your basement. If there are things you no longer use but are still useable, we WANT them! What happens to your "stuff?" if it is truly useful to someone else, it is placed in one of the SVdP Thrift Stores. People in need are able to shop with vouchers provided by Vincentians and select the things they need at no personal cost. The public is also able to shop in the the Thrift Stores, and the money spent on the donated items within the stores is used to support the mission of SVdP. If donated items are in fact, not useful or salable, they may be baled and shipped overseas for use in third world countries or as rags. SVdP realizes a financial benefit with these transactions as well. However, we respectfully request that you do not leave items that are dirty, wet, or definitely "trash."

On a different topic, St. Clare will be hosting a Vincentian Training workshop, known as an Ozanam Orientation on Saturday, April 28<sup>th</sup> from 9 am until about 1 pm. All Vincentians are requested to take this training within their first year of service, so there will be participants from all over the archdiocese attending. Mrs. White has written a wonderful synopsis of what her 6<sup>th</sup> grade homeroom had been doing prior to our Easter break. Mrs. White certainly showcases the wonderful studies and activities that take place at St. Clare School. Please enjoy!

6<sup>th</sup> grade has been busy throughout 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter! Along with our regular studies of Religion, practicing our Lectio Divina, studying verb parts, sentence diagramming, vocabulary, our nonfiction reading unit and getting our AR points (whew!), we have been broadening our horizons with wonderful school-wide enrichment units! We had a chance to dress as our favorite book characters, and had a donation jeans day to collect funds for the CCA, Children's Craniofacial Organization. 6<sup>th</sup> grade managed to be the class that contributed the most to the school fund. We were fortunate enough to have Nathan Anderson, whom has the same Treacher Collins syndrome that Augie, the main character in *Wonder* has, and his family come to our school to share with us their real-life experiences with this syndrome.

We are always busy learning, praying, and growing at St. Clare School! And as you can see 6<sup>th</sup> grade's 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter was packed with many additional wonders.




