

#### Changes this summer

As the parishes of St. Clare and St. Philomena continue their journey together, the Transition Team has recommended the following changes be implemented this summer:

- July 1st: Our bulletins have been combined, with Diocesan as our vendor. The bulletin is now called the St. Clare and St. Philomena Bulletin and will contain content from both parishes. There are 12 pages of content with combined advertisers supporting it. This is the first week of our new bulletin - it is a work in progress and we ask for your patience.
- Our Religious Education programs will be combined. All families have been notified and registration forms are available online or at the back of our churches.
- July 3rd will be the last daily Mass on Tuesday morning at St. Philomena. Parishioners from both parishes are encouraged to attend daily Mass at St. Clare of Montefalco on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday at 8:00am, and Tuesday at 6:30pm.
- August 5th: The new weekend Mass schedule at St. Philomena will begin, with the Mass continuing to be offered on Saturday at 4:00 pm, and the two Sunday Masses combined at 10:00am. Visiting priests have been notified as well as parish ministers. Fr. Andrew and visiting priests will cover the Masses on a rotating basis. The Saturday confession time remains unchanged.

Further updates will be posted in the bulletin and on the website. As the details of each of these changes are being finalized, please keep us in your prayers, and we will keep you in ours. Continued on page 5

## News and Events In Our Parish Community

#### God's Garden

By summertime, gardens are offering a wide variety of roses, dahlias, vines and beautiful annuals such as snapdragons, phlox and petunias. Don't overlook fruit branches and vegetables. Fruits and berries are the perfect elements for adding texture and interest to your arrangement. PINK: Begonias, hibiscus and fuchsia. You would be surprised at how well fuchsia last as cut flowers. Start with these first. They provide both foliage and foundation. Their hanging blooms add so much texture. Next place the hibiscus in the vase. Then add different colors and textures of begonias. Finally add three large leaves – arrowhead if you can find them. Don't make your arrangement symmetrical, let it flow freely. GREEN: another refreshing look to design. A walnut branch with nuts still on, green hydrangeas, 'lime cordial' zinnias, ranunculus, and a branch of a weeping willow, Chinese lanterns and spray roses. Begin with the walnut branch and weeping willow to form the structure. Add the hydrangeas. Next the Chinese lanterns and then the zinnias. The light pink of the spray roses are a lovely pairing with the green. You can put a few orchids in if you choose, then finally add the ranunculus. It should look like a painting. For a bold MAGENTA look, use fuchsia again, garden roses and spray roses and anemones. A stunning simple WHITE arrangement can be achieved by using white lilies, roses, snowberry, anemone clematis, mock orange and, again, ranunculus. This will have a heavenly aroma. These look lovely in a glass vase, again, put together very freely. Of course, don't forget a patriotic arrangement for the 4th. Mixing red and white roses, anemone, and sweet peas then insert flags, blue and white ribbon, will give you a "bang up" arrangement!
