


The American/Jamaican Servants of Mary are under the present leadership Sr. Mary Gehringer and her Council and has its Motherhouse (headquarters) at Our Lady of Sorrows Convent in Omaha, NE. The leadership team is responsible for overseeing the spiritu-

al, community, and ministerial needs of the Sisters and Associates. (Sr. Mary served in the Detroit area at St. John Berchman, St. Joan of Arc and in the Archdiocesan Office)

Early Servite Sisters brought their mission of compassionate service to the United States. They established a firm foundation in the States in 1893 in Indiana. The Sisters continued to move to areas where there was a need.

Servites came to Detroit beginning in 1931 and established the schools at St. John Berchman, (1931-1982); St. Juliana, (1941-1990); and Servite High, (1949-1985).



Presently there are 18 Servants of Mary serving in Michigan. 10 professed religious and 8 associates. Since the above schools have closed, our sisters have ministered as administrators, teachers, chaplains, religious education directors, Pastoral Associates, Hospice Healers, Secretaries and Prayer Ministers.

We are grateful to all who have helped us to minister in Michigan and in the United States. Our prayers are especially with you on this day of Celebrating 125 years in the United States.

God's Garden By Patricia Kolojeski

I was planning on cutting back the cone flowers (Echinacea) at church last week, but decided against it when I was looking out the window at home and saw some gold finches pecking away at the seeds. Well I thought it more important to feed the birds than cut some old dead flowers! Each flower has a bristly iridescent orange center cone that provides lively contrast with the reflexed petals and is a feeding station for the birds and butterflies. It is not a graceful plant, but big and bold. Rudbeckia is still thriving now. It is sometimes called an orange cone flower, but many can't help calling it Black eyed Susan. It will bloom until frost. It's one of the best for Michigan gardens. The rose turtlehead has a fascinating appearance due to the unusual structure of its flowers. Each deep rose tubular bloom resembles a turtle's head with lower lip protruding and mouth agape. I am entering mine in a "Best of Bloom" competition next week. It's a strange image, but the satiny pink flowers arranged in spikes like snapdragons are gorgeous. It is an easy, long lived and engaging plant. What's thriving in your garden now?




