Today the church in our Archdiocese celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The chronology of dating the Ascension to forty days after Easter is only mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospels reflect a different time sequence. By the fifth

century the observance noted in Acts became the universally accepted timeline.

For the past seven weeks we have been celebrating the most joyous season of the Catholic liturgical year. The Easter season fills us with immense joy and profound hope. The Lord has truly risen. I hope that you have felt His presence. Our parish's Whittier Wall project depicting our own Unleashing the Gospel (UTG) in action also provides us with some inspiration and reassurance of His presence in our church and in the ministries so many parishioners are involved in. 

Bruce Higgins, Head of Maintenance, has done a great job all year studying the boilers and putting into place new systems to enhance the boiler operations. From automatic chemical feeds to a new water conditioner for the boilers. We are working hard to keep our boiler tubes healthy and in good condition. We will plan



to open them up and clean them out over the summer. During this time, we will have our regular inspection by the insurance company. Bruce has also been busy upgrading fluorescent tube lighting systems to LED whenever possible on campus.



The church and Social Hall have never been so busy with all the masses and events going on in the Parish. Maintenance Associate, Mike Curtsinger, has taken great pride in keeping the facilities clean and healthy. It is a constant challenge to make sure we are ready for the next group coming in to use the facilities.

Mike makes sure the church is in order, floors and restrooms clean, and floors waxed regularly. He manages the Social Hall set-ups and watches the hall and kitchen, so they are ready for the next group who is going to use them. It is a thankless job but very important. Thank you, Mike, for your patience and pride for taking care of the St. Clare facilities.
