

Synod Proposition – family – part two

Passing on the faith to children is the work of the family. Thus, the main focus of Synod 16 was the care for the Christian Family. Our parish is taking that charge

seriously. In the previous bulletin we shared some ideas and opportunities we want to provide in our parish. Today's bulletin features a few ideas that come from the digital and print world, ideas that the AOD Office of Evangelization prepared and are available online. Be sure to check them out, see where the Holy Spirit is inviting your family. Use these resources to enrich your family and keep it **healthy, blessed, beautiful and growing**.

52 Sundays for Families As you read the third proposition for our parish MSP on page 4 of this bulletin, I want to share an exciting new resource for families called 52 Sundays. This book is a roadmap that will guide families to live Sundays together in a counter-cultural, faith-filled way. Spanning the entire 2020 calendar year, 52 Sundays includes a resource book and an online component that leads families through weekly exercises based on the Sunday Gospels. It also includes reflections on the saints, a specific prayer activity and a recipe for each week. The material encourages dialogue, giving families an opportunity to digest the material and bounce ideas off one another. "This is a chance for families to make Sunday a day about the Lord."

Resource books are available in English and Spanish at 52Sundays.com. All material will be available to download for free. Families can also follow along with each week's lessons and activities on the Unleash the Gospel Facebook page beginning in January.

Unleash The Gospel - Family Part 2

The 2016 Synod issued a Family Proposition:
“Envision and develop a practical plan for ongoing human and spiritual formation for all stages of life.”

On Sunday mornings as we come together for Mass at St. Clare, our pews are filled with young families, teens, young adults, singles, seniors, couples, the young and the old. A diverse population to be sure, we are a melting pot of people!

We gather together as a Catholic family to worship - such a beautiful witness to our faith. When looking at this through the eyes of Unleash the Gospel, we want to expand on this unity we find at Mass. What would that look like?

The Missionary Strategic Planning process challenges our parish to develop plan for **all ages and stages of life.**

To do so, we began to develop a list of ideas that would meet the needs and interests of various age groups that will continue to grow with your suggestions.

Sr. Rebecca is working on expanding our Ministry of Care that provides spiritual and temporal care to parishioners. This particular ministry tends to service our seniors, however is available to all in our parish, those in hospitals, nursing homes, and the homebound. Our senior population is a vibrant group, we plan to initiate social gatherings that will occur regularly, keeping them active and engaged.

Our young families juggle many tasks, the challenges of finding time and constraints on budgets often limit their ability to participate in parish life activities. We will create a child care ministry that will be available during our events where the children are cared for by certified sitters. This will allow the parents the opportunity

to partake in some parish life activities. Currently the child care ministry is offered on a limited basis at some of our Thursday Faith Formation events.

A family retreat, family fun day, and our parties, worship and faith formation activities will have family centered focus to encourage their participation.

Promoting lectures, field trips, Bible studies, retreats and faith formation activities that enhance our spiritual and cultural growth, will become part of the parish calendar.


Reconnecting with the graduates of our school and Religious Ed. programs is planned. By creating and using an updated database and social media platforms, we will inform, invite and encourage their participation in their alma mater. Reactivating our high school youth group.

We have a great sacramental program at St. Clare. We want to build on the bonds formed in these programs by establishing post-sacramental support and social groups. We want to offer

continuity within our community so there is a seamless flow to broader activities available in the parish where people are comfortable being part of another activity or event we offer.

Methods of Giving


- **Cash** – The most familiar way to make a Christmas or year-end gift. Simply write a check to make your gift.
