



From the Desk of Father Andrew



Dear Parishioners,

Three weeks ago, my article in the bulletin said this:

The Season of Lent is like hiking in the mountains, we know that if we keep steady on the path, we will reach the summit, for us that will be Easter. It is neither quick nor easy, but we embrace the challenge as we strive to be holy and live our lives intentionally, in such a way that it is obvious to whom we belong and what our priorities are.

Well, I think we have met the mountain, and certainly the path doesn't appear to be quick or easy! The international health challenge we face today is real, so we look for new ways we never dreamed we would need to implement our quest to be holy.

With this in mind see the following directives being issued based on Governor Whitmer's "Stay Home, Stay Safe" executive order of March 23, 2020. These directives are in place through Easter Monday, April 13, 2020.

1. **In cooperation** with the governor's executive order, we have closed our parish office. Employees, if they are able, will work from home. After discussions with staff and also within the Vicariate, we have made the difficult decision to close our church as well, to keep safe those working here and those who would come. Please take advantage of many innovative ways to spiritually support your faith, including livestreaming of Masses from various sources, St. Clare included. Sister Kathy's article provides a sampling of electronic sites where you can access different ways to read, listen, watch and grow in faith with your family.
2. **Funerals and weddings are suspended during this time.** Graveside services are still permitted provided they observe proper social distancing. We will contact all scheduled wedding couples to address their individual situation.
3. **Baptisms are also suspended during this time.**

We will contact all scheduled baptisms to reschedule the date. Where there is a real danger of death, the person can and should be baptized in the hospital or home of the parents. There are chaplains available at Beaumont and St. John, they are there to assist you. You can also call Fr. Andrew at (313) 647-5030.

4. **I am celebrating private Mass daily.** Our usual weekend liturgies are being broadcast from the Rectory Chapel via our Facebook Page at the regular Mass time. I am remembering all Mass intentions which have been allocated, however, if you would like to change the day your Mass intention was scheduled, please contact Jozefa at (313) 647-5060 or JChmielewski@stclarem.org
5. **Private Confessions** are suspended unless someone is in dire need of the Sacrament. Confessions via telephone or internet are not permitted. At this moment our current conditions do not constitute "grave necessity" for general absolution to be used in the Archdiocese of Detroit.
6. **Anointing of the Sick** for those in dire need of the sacrament, this can still be performed in the home of the individual, the hospital or health care facility, following the directives of the individual health care facility.
7. **Parish First Communion and Confirmation** are suspended until further notice.
8. **Administering the Sacraments of Initiation to those in RCIA** is to be postponed until a later date when the fuller community can be present.

Holy Week

Services will be streamed live from both St. Clare and the Cathedral. Times will be posted in the coming days.

1. **Palm Sunday:** Palms will be blessed for distribution in the parish at a later date.
2. **Chrism Mass:** will be celebrated on Monday of Holy Week (6 April) at the Cathedral by the Archbishop privately. Arrangements will be made for the oils to be distributed to the parishes through the Vicars.
3. **Parish Triduum liturgies and Easter Sunday** will

be offered in private. Triduum liturgies with Archbishop Vigneron will be livestreamed from Blessed Sacrament Cathedral as well as from the Rectory Chapel of our Church.

Please know that I realize these are sad and difficult times for all of us. Lent, the Triduum and Easter are the holiest days of the year for the faithful. I urge you not to let sadness or anger over these decisions fill your heart, rather if you could, turn your thoughts to the One who died for us, and in



gratitude recognize all that we have within our means to still celebrate these special days. I know it is not the same, but we can and we must try to remain focused, not on what we are missing, but the gift of what we have in our Lord Jesus. There will be a day and time when once again we will fill our pews and joyfully celebrate our faith as a parish community. I look forward to that celebration as well.

St. Vincent de Paul News

Greetings everyone:

During these challenging times we know that not everyone has been able to access the food that they need. Our St. Clare St. Vincent de Paul Pantry is currently closed however we have made some arrangements to have some food and other service available.



ANYONE IS ELIGIBLE – there are three ways to access food:

1. **PREPACKED FOOD BOXES** are available for pickup outside the Parish Office - Whittier entrance – the food is in plastic bins and is prepacked into small boxes. Each box is the SAME and contains canned chicken, beans, 2 cans vegetables, peanut butter, rice, and oatmeal. The bins will be restocked daily as long as the boxes last. (When the boxes are depleted, we will come up with another option.)
2. **SENIORS:** If you are unable to come to us – we can come to you – give us a call and one of our volunteers will shop our pantry for you and deliver to your door
3. **OTHER REQUESTS:** Depending on your need and what we have in stock we may be able to assist you further – please call our hotline and a volunteer will let you know what we have and how we can make the food available to you.

PLEASE NOTE WE ARE A DRY PANTRY - WE DO NOT HAVE ANY DAIRY, MEAT, FRESH FRUIT OR VEGETABLES and currently we DO NOT HAVE ANY PAPER PRODUCTS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As citizens of Michigan, we join with our neighbors in observing measures to address the spread of COVID-19. As we continue to practice social distancing to limit the virus' spread, our response as the Body of Christ must always begin in faith. We believe Jesus is still Lord. We believe that God can bring good from this time. We believe that we are not abandoned but remain – however mysteriously – in the loving hands of the Father.

It is with great sadness that I have to announce to you that Holy Week celebrations will not be offered publicly this year in the Archdiocese of Detroit. To ensure we cooperate with and support the governor and local health officials during this time as well as assuring you of my continued commitment to the work of unleashing the Gospel, I am issuing these directives regarding the life of our parishes, the administration of the Sacraments – particularly to those who are sick and dying – and the celebration of Holy Week.

While it is not possible for us to gather in our parishes

during Holy Week and on Easter, it is possible for us to be connected in other ways. I ask you to remain attentive to aod.org and spiritualcloseness.org for ways to be connected with each other during these days. I would also ask you to please continue your financial support to your parish. They rely entirely on your contributions and your generosity. I am very grateful for your support, especially during this time.

I know this is an unprecedented time in the life of our local Church. But unprecedented challenges bring unprecedented graces. If we unite ourselves to the Lord we will emerge from these days of trial and uncertainty more ready to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

WeShare - Online Giving

A Simple Guide to Online Donations for New Users

HOW DO I LOG IN?

The Login button is located in the top-right corner of the site. If this is your first visit to the site, you will not log in until you have submitted your first transaction.

Once your first donation or payment has been submitted you will receive a log-in email, providing a temporary link to set your password. Use the link in the email to **complete your user account** by establishing your secure password. Once completed, you will have access to all of your donation or payment information and can make changes at any time.

HOW DO I MAKE A RECURRING DONATION?

Making a donation or payment is extremely simple. First, click on an individual collection. There will be two options: **Recurring Donation or Payment** and **One Time Donation or Payment**. We will review both options.

1 To begin a recurring donation or payment, you will first choose an amount and then select the donation frequency from the options provided.



2 You will then decide when to start and end your recurring donation or payment. You can choose to start your transaction right away or at a later date of your choosing. You can also choose a date for this recurrence to end.




3 Now you will select the payment source for your donations. Choose the payment type from the options provided, then enter your payment information.



4 Fill in your basic contact information.



5 Check the "I Agree" box and click **Create Your Recurring Transaction** button to authorize the donation.



HOW DO I MAKE A ONE-TIME DONATION?

Click on a collection of your choice, then select the **One Time Donation** or **One Time Payment** button.

Indicate the donation or payment amount and proceed through steps 3 and 4 outlined above.

After completion, check the "I Agree" box and click **Submit Your One Time Donation** button to authorize your transaction.






Scammers are taking advantage of fears surrounding the Coronavirus Avoid Coronavirus Scams

Here are some tips to help you keep the scammers at bay:

- Hang up on robocalls. Don't press any numbers. Scammers are using [illegal robocalls](#) to pitch everything from scam Coronavirus treatments to work-at-home schemes. The recording might say that pressing a number will let you speak to a live operator or remove you from their call list, but it might lead to more robocalls, instead.
- Ignore online offers for vaccinations and home test kits. There currently are no vaccines, pills, potions, lotions, lozenges or other prescription or over-the-counter products available to treat or cure Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) — online or in stores. At this time, there also are no FDA-authorized home test kits for the Coronavirus. Visit the [FDA](#) to learn more.
- Fact-check information. Scammers, and sometimes well-meaning people, share information that hasn't been verified. Before you pass on any messages, contact trusted sources. Visit [What the U.S. Government is Doing](#) for links to federal, state and local government agencies.
- Know who you're buying from. [Online sellers](#) may claim to have in-demand products, like cleaning, household, and health and medical supplies when, in fact, they don't.
- Don't respond to texts and emails about [checks from the government](#). The details are still being worked out. Anyone who tells you they can get you the money now is a scammer.
- [Don't click on links from sources you don't know](#). They could download viruses onto your computer or device.
- Watch for emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or experts saying they have information about the virus. For the most up-to-date information about the Coronavirus, visit the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC) and the [World Health Organization](#) (WHO).
- Do your homework when it comes to donations, whether through [charities](#) or crowdfunding sites. Don't let anyone rush you into making a donation. If someone wants donations in cash, by gift card, or by wiring money, don't do it.
