Our Lady

My column this week is dedicated to Our Lady and the different prayers we say, devotions we have and the honor we offer to the Mother of our Lord. Of course, there is: The Rosary, Magnificat, Memorare, Angelus and Under Your Protection prayer. In addition there are prayers associated with Mary's apparition and places of pilgrimage. The months of May and October are designated in Mary's honor, as well as many other feasts or titles she received over the years; Help of Christians, Star of the Sea, Queen of Apostles etc.

There are four Marian antiphons, which are beautiful ancient prayers dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. These antiphons are "seasonal" shifting according to the liturgical calendar throughout the year. I have listed them below by date and with the prayer associated with the season, perhaps you could start now, as a form of prayer honoring our Lord through Mary. There are several translations. These are the most common.

Regina Coeli (Queen of Heaven)

From Easter Sunday through Pentecost

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia. For Christ, your Son and Son of God. Alleluia. Has risen as He said. Alleluia. Pray for us to God. Alleluia. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia. Because the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia.

Salve Regina (Hail Holy Queen)

From after Pentecost until Advent. (Ordinary Time)

Hail holy Queen, Mother of mercy hail our life our sweetness and our hope. To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To you do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, your eyes of mercy toward us, and after this exile show to us the blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Alma Redemptories Mater (Loving Mother of the Savior)

From Advent through the Feast of the Presentation February 2nd

Loving Mother of the Redeemer, gate of heaven and star of the sea. Assist your people who have fallen yet

strive to rise again. To the wonderment of the nature you bore your Creator yet remained a virgin after and before. You who received Gabriel's joyful greeting, have pity on us poor sinners.

Ave Regina Coelorum (Hail Queen of Heaven)

From February 3 through the end of Lent.

Hail, O Queen of Heaven enthron'd, Hail, by angels Mistress own'd Root of Jesse, Gate of morn, of which the world's true light was born. Glorious Virgin, joy to thee, lovelies whom in Heaven they see, fairest thou where all are fair. Plead with Christ our sins to spare.

Easter Prayer

The Easter prayer Regina Coeli ("Queen of Heaven" in Latin) is a wonderful tribute to our Lord's resurrection and to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Its origins are unknown, it dates back to the 13th century. Traditionally, it is prayed in place of another well-known prayer, the Angelus, during the Easter Season. We began to pray this prayer at daily at noon via Facebook since the outbreak of coronavirus. You can join us in prayer wherever you are.

V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.
R. For Christ, your Son and Son of God. Alleluia.
V. Has risen as He said. Alleluia.
R. Pray for us to God. Alleluia.
V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.
R. Because the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech You, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Virtual Rosary

Thank you for joining me along with our parishioners in the online prayer opportunities we do three times a day. It was great to be able to have lectors and musicians join us for the Easter Mass so I was thinking... and came up with an idea... I would like to invite you, and especially younger parishioners, to join me in leading the evening rosary. It's really simple; here's how it works. You will call in at 8:25 PM, 5 minutes before we begin at 8:30 PM. I will put you on hold and you will pray 10 Hail Mary's. Please indicate which day of the week you want to join in prayer. I will assign the Mystery you will pray. You do not have to be FB user to make a call. I hope you will take me

Something for others

During this time of physical distancing and order to stay home many people are searching to do something for others. I spoke with Janet Guensche, former Pastoral Associate at St. Clare, and she shared what her family is doing during this difficult time. Here is her story: If you are sitting at home quarantined and feeling alone and depressed, I have the perfect solution for you! Do something for someone. It doesn't have to be an earth-shattering thing; just a little thoughtful gesture.



A friend of my son manages a local pharmacy. She is concerned for her employees because of the rapidly spreading coronavirus. Her workers have stayed on the job and worked steadily – with some of them actually moving out of their homes to protect their family members from the possibility of getting the disease. Early on, some pharmacies did not provide masks to protect their employees from customers who may be carrying the disease. Even now, many employees must assist others face to face with no protective screen between them.



I found it easy enough to look up patterns for home-made masks right on my telephone, and began making them from clean, bleached, sheets. Once I got on a roll, I could make 12 masks a day while

continuing to take care of my family. My husband got into the act by designing disposable filters to go inside the masks. Meanwhile, my son designed and made Plexiglas "sneeze guards" so that the employees would have something between them and their customers as they continued to serve others in such an essential way. Once word got out that one pharmacy had them, other stores called to ask if he would make more, and so he did. He suited up with gloves and a homemade mask, and continued



to go to the hardware store for supplies. As the demand grew, my husband became his assistant.

These are small things that we have been doing during this quarantine. They give us a purpose and make us feel better. What can you do while you are waiting out this virus? Here are some suggestions:

- Pray for those who are suffering
- Call a shut-in just to let them know you care
- Make a meal for an elderly neighbor
- Call your local hospital and ask if your home sewing can assist in any way
- Email an old friend with whom you have lost touch
- Do some spring yard cleanup for a neighbor who can no longer do it
- Take your grandmother's garbage cans in and out for her
- Pick up groceries for someone who cannot get out
- Continue to support your local parish
- Mail a card to someone to let him or her know you care (use up those greeting cards that come as a gift for supporting an organization)
- Knit or crochet an item for someone . . .
- I am sure you can come up with many more ways to help others, and by doing so I guarantee that you will be helping yourself to feel better as we all wait out this quarantine! *Janet Guensche*

The St. Clare **SVDP food pantry** is offering


