Renovations

School renovations are almost complete, everything is looking great, fresh, and new! Our focus now shifts to the parish hall and kitchen. As noted last week the social hall is not available for use as the renovations begin this week. Chair, Bill Harrington, and the committee continue to meet regularly finalizing the design and detail elements for our lower level rooms. Thank you to all members of the committee for their work and dedication. We look forward to having a user-friendly hall and kitchen available in the near future for our parish activities.

Update from Elizabeth

I begin my 11th chemotherapy cycle this week. 12-14 total cycles are planned if all stays on track, which will put me finishing this "treatment plan" around the end November - beginning of January. I will have some more scans in November that will help us determine

how many more cycles we are going to do. So far the scans aren't perfect, but they are good -- they show small lesions in my lungs that have resolved on their own -- these could be cancer, but they also could just be inflammation from the chemotherapy and radiation -- so the doctor is hopeful that that is what they are. They are not large enough to warrant a biopsy at this time. They will continue these scans every three months for several years even after this treatment course is complete. So my prayer, of course, is that we never see any spread of the cancer and that this course of treatment completely cures it. My arm and shoulder have healed really well after my surgery in June, and I can do most daily activities very well. The chemotherapy side effects are getting more challenging as I get further along in the treatment course, but that is to be expected, and so far they have been treatable. I've needed some blood transfusions and also had one hospital stay for an infection, but fortunately that resolved without major complications.

Let us continue to pray for Elizabeth and all those who are in need of healing. Thank you also for your prayers for my Mom and my family.

I would like all parents to also be there to worship with their child/children. Masks must be worn and responding and singing are required!!

COVID-19 Update: Our country, state and city continue to be affected by the Covid-19 virus, particularly the Delta variant which is more highly contagious. At this point we know that our children and the unvaccinated are the most vulnerable and waning antibodies in our older and compromised populations have led to recommending a booster vaccine shot. We are fast approaching the cold and flu season as well. Following the recommendation of the CDC, Wayne County, and AOD we are asking parishioners to wear face masks in the church. We realize this is often an issue of contention, and we appreciate your willingness to work with us to keep everyone safe. For those who participate in a ministry on the altar, masks will be required.
