STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In his Gospel today, the evangelist St. Luke authors Jesus' statement on true discipleship: *Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. We are asked to renounce our former life and possessions to make Jesus first in our lives.* In his *Unleash the Gospel* pastoral letter, Archbishop Allen Vigneron states, *Growing as his disciple demands a daily surrender to the one who loved us and gave his life for us: "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me" (Gal 2:20) (see: Unleash the Gospel, Marker 9.2, Grow).*

Discipleship requires sacrifice and may include persecution and suffering to witness Christ and His Truth. Are we willing to pay the cost? As an example, do we uphold the Church's teaching on sacramental marriage between one man and one woman at the risk of ridicule and persecution from the secular world?

PARKING LOT RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

A quick look at our parking lot will tell you that it is in pretty rough shape and in need of a new surface. In the Spring of 2021 parish leadership decided that it was time to take action. The initial plan was to resurface the lot and install new storm water sewers, consistent with the City of Grosse Pointe Park's ongoing plan to separate sanitary and storm water. An estimate for the project was generated by a paving consultant and we were on our way. In the summer of 2021, a committee consisting of retired engineers and architects from St. Clare was formed to oversee the project.

The vision was to have a new parking lot by Summer 2022 when school was out of session.

Just as planning was ramping up the Detroit area (including St. Clare) was deluged with historic rainfall and flooding. As a result of this flooding, Wayne County requirements for flood mitigation became more stringent, including the requirement that we temporarily detain a certain amount of rainwater in underground storage. The committee also recognized that more detailed upfront engineering would be required to receive approval from the various local, county, and state agencies. Wade Trim, a very experienced Civil Engineering firm, was retained to create designs, seek government approvals and oversee the project bidding process and construction. We had still hoped to get the project completed by the summer of 2022 but the governmental approval process has taken longer than we had hoped for and we missed our construction window for 2022. The down side to all this is that due to the requirements for underground storm water detention and the general change in economic conditions since last year we anticipate that our project costs will be approximately 50%-70% higher than initially thought. The plus side is that the City of Grosse Pointe Park will be paying to replace the nearly 100 year old water main that runs between Charlevoix and Mack. This water main has a history of breaking which has resulted in numerous repairs to the parking lot at great expense to St. Clare. We also

expect that all the new underground infrastructure will significantly reduce the risk of future flooding to the buildings on the St. Clare campus.

What to expect next: We anticipate that governmental approvals will be received very soon. We will seek competitive construction bids around January 1, 2023 and expect construction to begin in late Spring with completion during the summer months.

Your new parking lot will look a little different but the number of parking spaces will be approximately equivalent to the number we have today. Here are some of the highlights:

- All spaces in the main lot will be 90 degrees with two way traffic.
- Parking space width will be 6 inches wider than current spaces.
- Avery Lane will become one way (exiting to Charlevoix)
- Green space will be added where possible.
- Landscape islands will be added on the West end of the lot.
- A new water main will be installed between Charlevoix and Mack (paid for by City of GPP).

The new design was looked at with a focus on safety, efficiency and esthetics. Look for a design drawing to be available for review in the Church lobby in the next couple of weeks.


