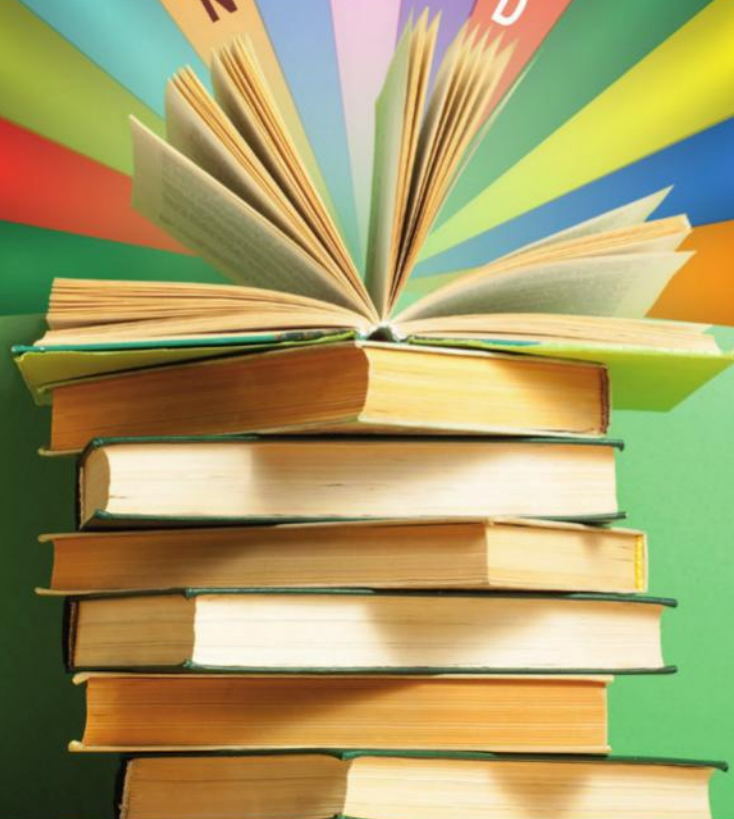

FROM THE DESK OF FR. ANDREW

How quickly the days of the calendar flip, this week we move into the month of February and our season of Lent begins in just three weeks...didn't we just put the Christmas decorations away!!!

As we continue following Jesus on his journey, we will explore some of His most quoted messages and challenges too, delivered by our Savior, told to us through the Gospel of Matthew, in the Sermon on the Mount. This Sermon provides the framework of the entire ministry of Jesus. As we listen to the Word, ask the Holy Spirit to inspire us to put into practice what we hear. **Be Bold. Be Holy. Be Catholic.**

Catholic Schools Week

This week we acknowledge, highlight, and celebrate all of our students, parents, school staff and administration who comprise our St. Clare School Community. Marks of the Church

In ancient professions of faith, the Catholic Church identifies itself as "one, holy, catholic and apostolic." These words found in the Nicene Creed and used at Sunday Mass refer to what are traditionally known as the "marks or dimensions" of the Church. Last Sunday we reflected on the first mark – the Church is one, as the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and the letter to the Corinthians provided a natural backdrop. I encourage you to read the few pages from the Catechism of the Catholic Church #811-865. (these are not page numbers, rather the points numbers at the beginning of

each paragraph). For the next few Sundays, we will reflect on the remaining dimensions of the Church.

Saints of the week

- **Monday** – Blessed Bronislaw Markiewicz (1842-1912) Polish priest, educator, writer, defender of the orphans, and founder of the Congregations of the Michaelite Fathers and Sisters.
- **Tuesday** - St. John Bosco (1815-1888), Italian priest, educator, writer and founder of the Salesian Fathers and Daughters and Mary Help of Christians.
- **Thursday** – Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Feast rooted in the Old Testament traditions. Mary and Joseph fulfill that law by presenting Jesus in the temple and making an offering.
- **Friday** – St. Blasé, one of the early martyrs of the church, reputed to be a doctor and healer of the throat.

Special celebrations this week

This is a big week with four special celebrations. As I mentioned we kick off the week with the special Mass for our School on Sunday at 11 am.

- **On Monday**, Fr. Tom and I are rejoicing as on this day we celebrate the feast day of our Blessed Founder, Fr. Markiewicz. We have his relics in our Holy Family Chapel, and they will be on display during the Mass at 8 am before the altar on that day. We give thanks for the Sisters, Brothers, and Priests who serve in many countries under the banner of St. Michael.
- **On Thursday**, Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we will have a special Mass in the morning at 8 am and evening at 7 pm to bless the candles that you use at home during your prayer time. Please bring your candles if you wish them to be blessed. During the month of January, we have journeyed together with the children of First Communion and Confirmation by relighting their baptismal candles at their special celebrations. On Thursday we will light and process with the candles you bring for blessing. This is a living reminder of Christ the Light that we should follow and that we are to keep that Light brightly lit for ourselves and to share it with others. We also celebrate **World Day of Prayer for Consecrated life on Thursday**. We will pray and recognize Sisters and Priests who have dedicated themselves to the consecrated life, who served and are serving at St. Clare.
- **On Friday** the Feast of St. Blasé we will pray for the healing of our throats by blessing them. Special Mass of Blessing will take place at 8 am. This is also First Friday, therefore, all are invited to spend some time with the Lord in Adoration

MLK LEGACY

When you go through your daily activities everyday and look around, what do you see? Just white people or just black people? No. You see all colors, ethnicities, and races together. But can you even imagine that once that wasn't how it was. People fought for human rights and for freedom and

the end of segregation in our nation. There were lots of activists, but one of the main fighters was Martin Luther King Jr (MLK).

King grew up in Atlanta, Georgia with an amazing mother and father. In a middle class working neighborhood. He attended the public schools in Atlanta and the high school. King grew up in a religious family attending a Baptist church. MLK's mother educated him about segregation in the south in his early years, and taught that he would face name calling each and every day but he was just as important. Martin was angered by the injustices and knew change was mandatory.

Martin Luther King Jr wanted to make a mark on history. He became head of Montgomery Improvement As-

sociation, the group that worked to end segregation policies on public transportation. He led the "March on Washington" where he made his "I Have A Dream Speech" and he spoke out about his wishes and changes of the future. He led many other boycotts against unfair laws and limits. MLK wanted change.

When you think of a legacy it's something you leave to get continued. Can you imagine that some of your closest friends wouldn't have known you if it wasn't for MLK. MLK wanted our nation to come together because when we do we are much greater. His legacy affects our everyday lives and still to this day we need to realize we are not perfect, we still need change. What if every time you went to school, the store, or work you got called a mean name? Would you want to go and make change or would you be scared knowing that so many people want to hurt and kill you. MLK lived through that, and loved everybody so immensely that he didn't care if they were mean to him and called him names; he still worked for equality, freedom, love and peace. That's why on Monday January 16 we celebrate a man of change. Although he is not with us today his legacy should always and forever be with us. I hope you learned the purity Martin Luther King Jr had in his heart and you can continue his legacy.

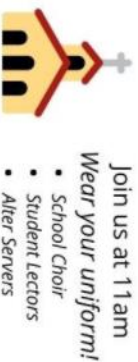

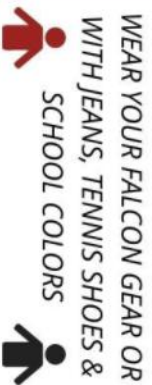

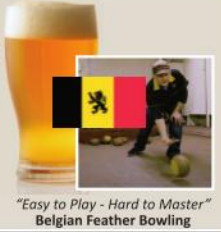
